Marshmal-O Fudge

Ever since a recipe given by Mrs. R. Frank Tucker for never-fail creamy chocolate fudge appeared in these columns more than two years ago, we have been asked to repeat the recipe rather frequently.

One of the secrets of the recipe was the use of marshmallo creme. It is the easiest candy recipe for the best keeping fudge you ever saw.

This year Penman Marshmal-O comes out with a Marshmal-O Fudge recipe printed on the cover of the jar. Here it is:

MARSHMAL-O FUDGE
Grease a pan measuring about 9 inches square.

Mix the following in a heavy 2-quart saucepan:
2½ cups sugar
¼ cup butter or margarine
¾ cup Pet evaporated milk
5-ounce jar Penman Marshmal-O

Bring to a bubbling boil quickly, stirring all the time. When bubbles appear all over the top, boil and stir over medium heat for five minutes.

Remove from heat and add 1 package Hershey's semi-sweet Chocolate Dainties. Stir until Chocolate Dainties are completely melted and blended into mixture.

Pour into greased pan. Cool thoroughly. Cut into 1½-inch squares. Makes 3 dozen squares or two pounds of chocolate fudge.

NUT CLUSTERS
Follow the foregoing recipe for Marshmal-O Fudge and, in addition to the Chocolate Dainties, add 2 cups whole peanuts, pecans or almonds. Stir until Chocolate Dainties are completely melted and blended into the mixture. Spread out on waxed paper and cool thoroughly.

Cut or break into pieces. Makes 2½ pounds of candy.

Mrs. McKay's Coffee Cake

Mrs. Douglas McKay, wife of the Republican candidate for U.S. Senate for Oregon, was entertained at coffee hours and lunch in Klamath County on October 10 when she and her husband visited this area.

Those of us who are safe at home in our little niches with life going along in its orderly fashion, have some difficulty in realizing the sacrifice Mrs. McKay is making in actively campaigning along with her husband.

Consider the gallons of coffee she must consume in her tours of the state. In Cottage Grove recently she attended coffee half-hours at 10 homes in one day, starting at 9:30 in the morning with time out for lunch. A community luncheon was arranged for Mr. and Mrs. McKay with the women of Cottage Grove preparing the food and making a charge of 25 cents a plate. A total of 462 persons were served lunch.

Mrs. McKay stated, and she probably shook hands at least once with every one of them.

It is always interesting to know what wives of candidates cook. Mrs. McKay has consented to the printing of a recipe for her favorite coffee cake. Here it is:

COFFEE CAKE
She prepares the filling first, chopping 1 cup of walnuts in a bowl, adding 1 cup brown sugar, 2 tablespoons flour and 1 tablespoon cinnamon. Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a pan approximately 9 x 13 x 2½ inches in which the coffee cake will be baked. Mix the nuts and sugar mixture with the melted butter in the pan.

Then prepare the batter:

1 cup sugar

¼ cup butter

2 eggs

½ cup milk

1½ cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder
Mix and spread a thin layer of batter in pan, sprinkle a layer of filling mixture, then another layer of batter (although this will not be evenly spread) and last another layer of filling. Bake in a moderate oven, 375 degrees, between 25 and 30 minutes, or until slightly brown and completely cooked.

FRIED TOMATOES
If you like fried or broiled tomatoes with steak, try using a little basil along with salt and pepper for seasoning.

RICE
When you are serving rice as a vegetable, use chicken or beef broth for the liquid in which it is cooked (bouillon cubes are easy). Cut down on amount of salt added. Finely chopped sautéed onion may be added to the cooked rice or finely chopped parsley.

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Trim it Yourself

Fuss and feathers, satin and lace can go to any woman's head, especially this season. Evening hats are back, to complete the elegant look of the new nostalgic fashions. Satin folds and velvet loops blossom with flowers of all kinds, but particularly the romantic rose, large or small, in every conceivable shade.

Actually, the glue is not limited to millinery uses. It is just as handy in repairing china, glass, jewelry, furniture, toys, handbags, lampshades, or bookbindings—or in applique work. Incidentally, dry cleaning won't hurt it, but laundering may loosen the bond. Beads, and glue, and nylon nets and laces—these are some of the
