Eden Selects New Minister
LONDON (AP)—Prime Minister Eden named a new and younger defense minister today and at the same time brushed aside complaints about the handling of reservists called back into uniform because of the Suez Canal crisis. Eden promoted 50-year-old War Secretary Antony Head to the post of minister of defense. Head, who succeeds Sir Walter Monckton, 65, has insisted right along that army reservists will have to stay in uniform until the Suez Canal dispute with Egypt is settled. Monckton was named paymaster general and remains in the Cabinet. He asked to be released from "the constant and mounting strain" of the defense office. John Hugh Hare, minister of state for colonial affairs, was appointed secretary for war. The government announcement of the changes made no reference to the numerous complaints of the handling of the reservists. But Head's elevation was a clear sign of Eden's confidence in him and was expected to strengthen the minister's hand against Labor party criticism when Parliament resumes sessions next week.

OTI Announces Bowling Skeds
The newly resurfaced Oregon Technical Institute bowling alley opened its fall season of play on Tuesday, October 9. A 12-team men's league, which meets each Tuesday and Wednesday evening, and a four-team women's league, which meets every Monday evening, have been formed. The alleys are available to the public for open bowling only on Thursday and Friday evenings from 7 to 10 p.m. and on Sunday afternoons from 2 until 6 p.m. The alleys will be ABC approved and news of OTI league standings will be published beginning next week.

SOCORRO, N.M. (AP)—A physics professor says he believes he has found a peaceful use for the fallout from a hydrogen bomb blast. Dr. Haro V. Butlar of New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology says the normal amount of radioactive tritium in the atmosphere is multiplied a hundredfold for about six months after an H-bomb explosion. Rain becomes supercharged with it. Progress of that water underground can be traced with instruments which register radioactivity. The importance of underground water courses in arid country is vital to farmers and ranchers who depend on wells.
