

Sam Coon Points To Four Years Of County Growth

Congressman Sam Coon Thursday evening pointed to four years of steady economic growth for Klamath County under the Eisenhower administration.

The lawmaker spoke at a dessert-coffee in the home of Mrs. Dick Henzel on Lakeview Highway.

"Today's prosperity is reflected right here in this county," he said, "where a number of new projects are adding to the economic base of the area."

He singled out the Johns-Manville insulating board plant north of Klamath Falls and the California Oregon Power Company's new power dam on the Klamath River as projects which will substantially increase the tax base of the county and provide more jobs.

Coon also mentioned the new Klamath Falls jet airbase, which he said will bring more people into the area and increase consumer spending.

In referring to federal aid to education, Coon told of two programs of aid "with no strings attached" which he supported in Congress this year.

One was the program of federal

aid to federally impacted areas, such as in Klamath Falls, where federal activity causes an influx of students. This district has received almost two million dollars in the last two years under this program, he said.

Coon said he also voted to give to the Oregon schools \$3,900,000 under a plan to return 1 per cent of the federal income tax collections to the state school systems.

He declared that the legislation was defeated in the Democratic-controlled Congress.

The lawmaker said that he supports federal aid if it can be obtained without federal controls, but opposes it when rules and regulations are involved, because he doesn't want "some bureaucrat in Washington, D.C., telling us how to run our local schools."

Coon journeyed to Bly Friday afternoon to visit a lumber mill and attend a coffee hour. He will attend the annual Klamath Basin Potato Festival banquet tonight at 6:30.

Cow Belles Meet Oct. 29

Mrs. Joe Oliver of John Day, president of the Oregon Cow Belles, will be a special guest at the annual fall luncheon of Klamath County Cow Belles at the Pelican Cafe on Monday, October 29.

In making the luncheon announcement, Mrs. Bill Gouldin, president of the Klamath County group, said Mrs. Oliver will come to Klamath Falls from Portland where she is slated to assist for the week with the Cow Belle booth at the Pacific-International Livestock Exposition.

Mrs. Dave Campbell of Bly, state vice president, will also be in Portland to help with the Cow Belle and Cattlemen's Association booths. Her husband is president of the Klamath County Cattlemen's Association.

Luncheon will be at 1 p.m. and notices are being mailed by the secretary to the 72 members of the county Cow Belle group.

This will be an important business meeting, Mrs. Gouldin stated. It is expected that plans will be announced for the 1957 Beef for Fathers Day promotion in which the Klamath group always takes a prominent part. Mrs. Gouldin and Mrs. Campbell will be in Portland on October 22 to attend a meeting of the executive board of the state Cow Belle association at which preliminary plans for the promotion will be decided.

Boivin Seeks Timber Aid

State Senator Harry Boivin said Friday that he will support a plan to have an interim committee appointed at the next session of the State Legislature to make a comprehensive study of the natural resources of the Klamath Indian Reservation.

Boivin also said he was in accord with the Klamath and Lake county courts which recently decided to ask Governor Elmo Smith to convene the State Board of Forestry for the purpose of getting such a study started.

"That is a splendid idea," Boivin said, "but it should be carried farther. I believe a legislative interim committee should be appointed. Such a committee could function when the Legislature is not in session."

"We must do anything possible to preserve one of the best kept forests in the United States," he continued. "Improper cutting of the reservation timber would not only cause great loss to Klamath County but the entire state. Proper control of this timber stand will maintain for Klamath County a permanent industry."

Boivin concluded with the assertion that although the federal government is now trying to work out a plan for terminating the reservation and protecting the timber, still Oregon should conduct an independent investigation of the problem to safeguard the interest of the state.
