Masses of yellow and bronze chrysanthemums were used at the altar and in the Williamson River Community Hall where guests gathered for the reception.

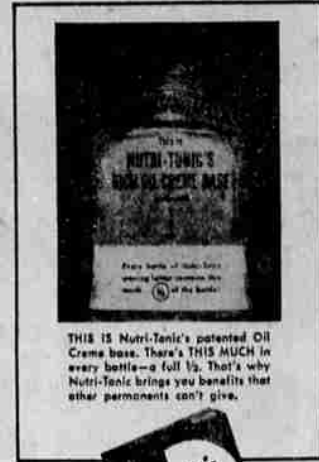
