

Purvine To Attend Meet

Winston D. Purvine, director of OTI in Klamath Falls, will participate in a workshop on higher education to be held at the St. Francis Hotel in San Francisco on Wednesday and Thursday.

The workshop is being sponsored by the Western Interstate Commission for higher education for the President's committee on education beyond the high school and is being financed by the Carnegie Corporation of New York.

Thirty five leaders in education from 11 western states will participate in the workshop and help plan a large regional conference on higher education to be held someplace in the west next spring.

The President's committee has been charged with studying problems brought on by greatly increased enrollments in universities and the relationship between the federal government and institutions of higher education.

Edgar W. Smith of Portland, a member of the committee and chairman of the Oregon committee on higher education, will serve as chairman of the workshop.

Also attending from Oregon will be John R. Richards, state chancellor of higher education and Charles J. Armstrong, president of Pacific University at Forest Grove.

Boivin, Geary Address Women

State Senator Harry Boivin and State Representative E. A. Geary were guest speakers at the recent meeting of the Business and Professional Women's Club held at the Willard Hotel. They spoke on legislative measures, appearing on the November 6 ballot.

Geary explained the financial budget set-up for the state, and the appropriations needed to carry and maintain the state institutions and the educational program.

Cabax Mills of Grants Pass purchased two tracts of timber offered for sale by the Medford District of the Bureau of Land Management October 18.

The first tract, containing an estimated 1,806,000 board feet located on Tyner Creek in the Illinois Valley area, was purchased for \$63,441.05. The second tract, containing an estimated 451,000 board feet located on Reeves Creek, also in the Illinois Valley area was purchased for \$17,948.95.

The young vocalist recently gave a concert in Klamath Falls which provided a substantial sum of money to augment her scholarship.

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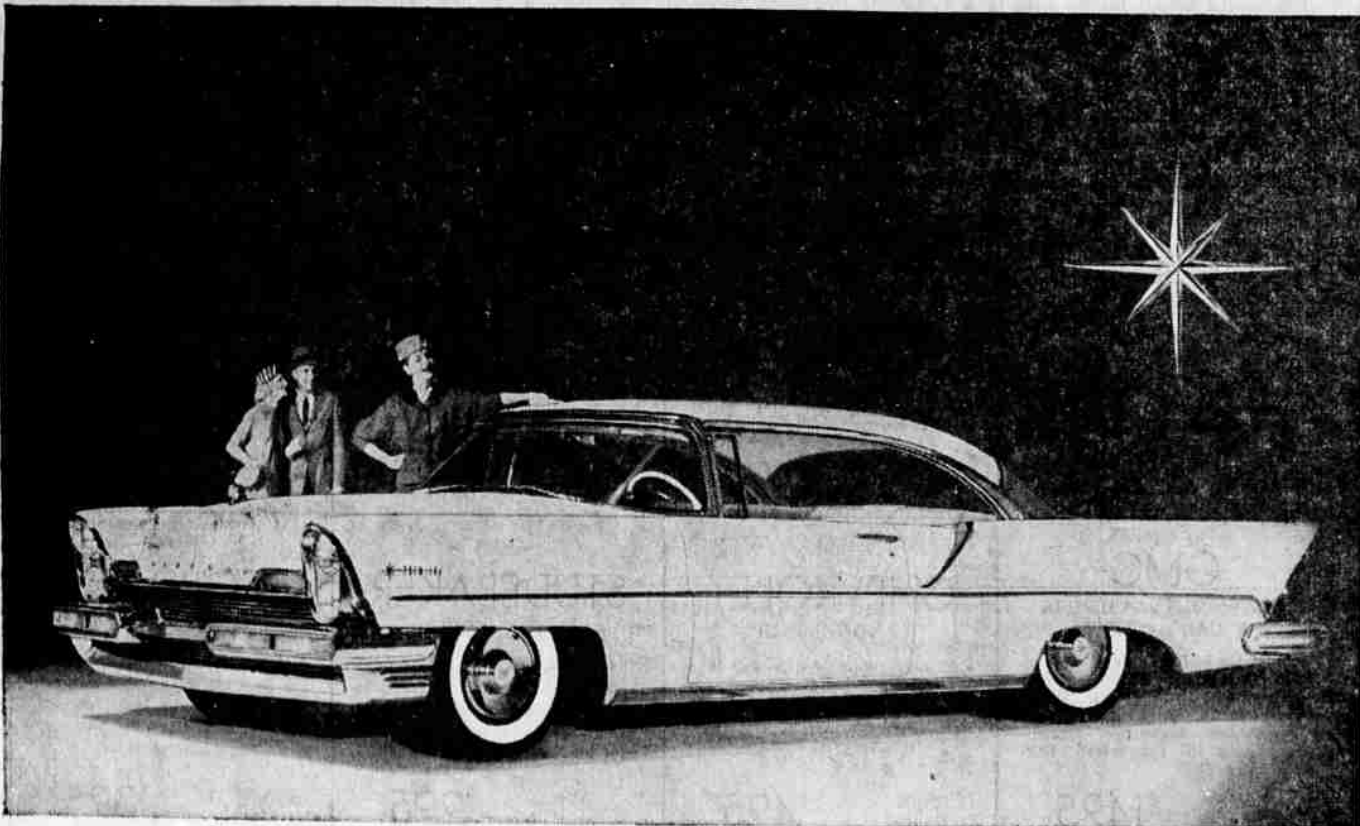
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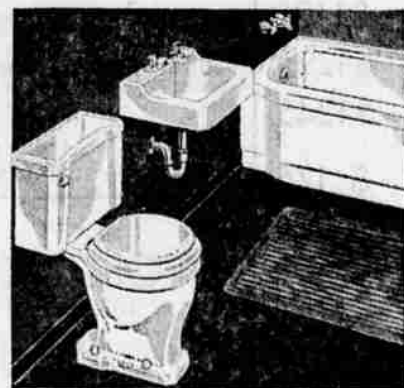


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
