Church Plans Dedication

LAKEVIEW — Ceremonies for the dedication of the new St. Richard's Catholic Church at Adel will be held Thursday morning, October 23. The building has been in process during September and October and will be completed this week with the exception of a few finishing details, and installation of pews.

Starting at 10:30 a.m. the solemn ceremony of dedication will be performed by the Most Rev. P. P. Leipzig, D. D., Bishop of the Baker Diocese. This will be followed by a Solemn High Mass, celebrated by the Rev. Francis McDonald of Baker; the Rev. Robert Samard and the Rev. Donald Sullivan, both of Ontario, will act as deacon and subdeacon. The Rev. John Phelan of Merrill will be master of ceremonies for the Mass. The guard of honor for the dedication will be made up of five fourth degree members from Archbishop Bulch's Fourth Degree Assembly of the Knights of Columbus. Captain of the group will be Otto Smith of Klamath Falls, with another member from that region to be joined by F. Carl Fetsch, Tom Flynn and Bob Alger from Lakeview.

Music for the Mass will be furnished by the high school choir from the Sacred Heart Academy in Klamath Falls, under the direction of Sister Cecilia Frances. Kyle Morgan is installing an electric organ for the occasion. Altar boys

are Pat Murphy and Lonnie Schader of Adel.

Luncheon afterward is being prepared by the Catholic ladies of the Adel community.

Riverman and Sons, of Portland, are the contractors. The building will seat 84 persons and, when

completed and furnished will cost approximately \$15,000. It is of brick veneer construction on a concrete slab floor. The roof is supported by an exposed laminated arch to be finished in natural wood color. The mahogany altar will also be finished in the natural color. Windows are in Gothic style of cathedral glass.
