Coon Speaks In Redmond

REDMOND — Congressman Sam Coon said here Wednesday that the Eisenhower administration has sought to keep the national budget balanced in the same way each American family does.

He told local Kiwanians at a noon luncheon that the budget has been balanced the last two years in a row, and that President Truman's last budget request was cut by over 13 billion dollars in 1953.

"No American family would think of running a deficit year after year, and yet some think that the government can do this and get away with it," Coon said.

He pointed out that when the national debt increases this and future generations suffer because of mounting interest payments, which add to the tax burden of each individual.

The best way to make tax cuts possible, he said, is to lower the debt and cut down on federal spending.

"This is just what this administration has been doing," he declared.

Coon told of an investigation he and two other congressmen made in 1953, which received notice this month in a national magazine.

The article told how they were able to save the taxpayers 6 million dollars through an inspection of government-owned property in 15 foreign countries, he said.

"The results of the investigation showed that federal spending can be reduced in many cases, thus making the taxpayers' burden lighter," he said.

"However, those who advocate a trend toward bigger government, and still talk about tax cuts aren't fooling anyone."

OSes To Start Winter Sked

The Klamath Falls office of the Oregon State Employment Service starts winter schedule today, Guy Barker, manager, announces.

Office hours will be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday of each week.
