



LOOKING FOR ANOTHER outstanding game this weekend is Oregon Tech's center and linebacker Don Baker, a Eureka, California freshman, who turned in a brilliant defensive job last Saturday in the Owls 27-20 upset over Southern Oregon. Baker, who made more than 50 per cent of the tackles for Tech in the first half of last week's game, will be playing against his hometown foes when the Owls and Humboldt State's junior varsity team mix at Modoc Field Saturday evening.

Oregon Tech Closes Home Grid Action Here Saturday

Coach Rex Hunsaker's 1956 footballing Oregon Tech Owls close out their home gridiron season Saturday night at Modoc Field in a big "Boy Scout Night" battle with the visiting Humboldt State College junior varsity team.

Game time for Tech's home finale is 7:30.

The meeting with Humboldt is a non-conference gridiron test for the Owls, and for once, the Techmen are pre-game picks to win. But not by too wide a margin.

Humboldt varsity competition on three different occasions. In 1951, Tech lost 19-12 to the Lumberjacks, then bounced back to win a one-point 7-6 margin in 1952. In 1953, Humboldt showed its power as the Owls fell 22-0. In the past two of three seasons, Humboldt's athletic fortunes have grown by leaps and bounds, making it one of the toughest college athletic plants in Northern California.

Shasta Junior College, boasting several of Southern Oregon's top prep stars of last year, whipped the Humboldt Jayvees 25-6 earlier in the year. The HSC Jayvees have been playing the junior varsity teams of the other four-year schools and the varsity teams of junior colleges such as Shasta and Oregon Tech.

Hunsaker listed his starting lineup yesterday as he announced he would go with about the same eleven that started the Southern Oregon game last Saturday afternoon. In the backfield for the Owls, Bob Stoy is expected to draw the quarterbacking chores, while Al Everson and Rich Pekula may open at the two halfback posts. Belton Ollison or Hugh Amen will handle the first call at fullback after each turned in outstanding ball carrying jobs last Saturday against the Red Raiders.

In the line, the only change seems to be at guard where injured Frank Wilson will be out for this game. Hunsaker will probably open with Allen Jones and Ed Judd at the guard positions. The tackle-lots will be given to either Monte Lewis, Tom Wylie or Norm Kollen, all three weighing over the 215-pound mark. At end will be lettermen Charles Eccleston and Al Van

Head Coach Jim Kelly, who has maintained all along that the long layoff after the team trials would not prove a handicap, repeated that the Yankee boys would be "in great shape" when a actual competition begins.

Southern California's weather has been ideal since the athletes began to check in two weeks ago and Kelly's only worry was that the boys might try to train too hard, too fast.

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College Footballers Eye Conference Tilts, Bowl Berths In Weekend Grid Contests

The Oklahoma - Notre Dame game at South Bend, Ind., Saturday is listed as the "big game" on college football's week end program, but there are several other battles which will have a direct bearing on conference championships and bowl berths.

Clemson got an early start on Saturday's heroes Thursday by edging South Carolina, 7-0, in their annual "Big Thursday" game at Columbia, S.C. The Tigers' victory enabled them to take over undisputed possession of first place in the Atlantic Coast Conference and moved them a step nearer to a New Year's Day engagement in the Orange Bowl.

Oklahoma A&M and Kansas meet today in a game originally

scheduled for Saturday, while George Washington hopes to take over undisputed first place in the Southern Conference tonight against William & Mary.

In two of Saturday's most important conference games, Iowa, the Big Ten Conference co-leader, plays Purdue at Lafayette, Ind., while Georgia Tech will risk its Southeastern Conference leadership against upstart Tulane at Atlanta, Ga.

Although Iowa is one of the 10 major perfect record teams remaining, the Hawkeyes are five-point underdogs against Purdue. Georgia Tech is a 13-point favorite over Tulane but will have to be on its toes against the Greenies, who have knocked off Navy and Mississippi in their last two games.

Another wing-ding battle is expected at Waco, Tex., where ninth-ranked Baylor will entertain seventh-ranked Texas A&M in an important Southwest Conference clash. Baylor is unbeaten in four games, but the Aggies are the favorites off their upset victory over Texas Christian last week.

If Stanford can get by Southern California in their Pacific Coast Conference "pick 'em" game the Indians will be on the road to the Rose Bowl. But Chuck Taylor's young men will have to stop the

Trojans' Jon Arnett, who will be playing his final college game.

In the other major conferences, Princeton can tie Yale for the Ivy League lead by beating Cornell. Colorado hopes to remain unbeaten in the Big Seven against Nebraska, and Montana State risks its perfect Rocky Mountain record against Colorado Western.

There doesn't seem to be much hope for Notre Dame in its tussle with Oklahoma, which will be nationally televised. The Sooners dropped out of first place in the United Press ratings this week following Michigan State's 47-14 victory over Notre Dame, so they probably will attempt to out-do the Spartans against the Irish.

Top-ranked Michigan State, however, isn't expected to surrender its spot that easy, and will show little mercy against Illinois. Fourth-ranked Tennessee should romp over Maryland, fifth-ranked Michigan meets Minnesota in their annual "Little Brown Jug" game, eighth-ranked Ohio State hopes to

bounce back from its loss to Penn State against Wisconsin, and Texas Christian, tied with Baylor for ninth place, entertains Miami.

Other major games include West Virginia at Penn State, Oregon at Pittsburgh, Army at Columbia, Navy at Penn, Colgate at Yale, Northwestern at Indiana, Iowa State at Missouri, Houston at Auburn, Kentucky at Georgia, Texas at Rice, Florida at LSU, North

Carolina State at Duke, UCLA at Oregon State, and California at Washington.
