

Malin, Merrill In Showdown

B-Loop Crown At Stake

The Klamath County B League football race is going down to the wire, and nobody will know who will represent this B circuit in the district playoffs next week until the last game of the season is completed Saturday afternoon at Malin.

The game: Malin vs. Merrill.
The place: Malin.
The time: 2 o'clock.
The prize: The county championship.

Coach Jack McGoldrick's Mustangs from Malin, and Coach Al Keck's Huskies from Merrill are the only teams with games remaining on the 1956 schedule, and both are undefeated as they go into their final and all-important games.

For the over-all season's play, Malin is undefeated in five regular games and two practice tilts with Tulelake's Honkers. Merrill has won five and lost one, that a 7-0 nod to Henley in the second game of the year at Gem Stadium. In league play, both have a 3-0 mark as the home stretch battle looms.

For McGoldrick's Mustangs of Malin, it is an old tale fighting for the county's small school jackpot. Malin has either been tied, or sitting on the grid throne all alone in six of the last seven years. Only a Merrill sweep of league laurels in 1950 has kept the Mustangs from a straight shoot since 1949.

The Malin entry has won the title outright in 1949, 1951, 1953 and 1955. Last year the Mustangs went all of the way under Jim Conroy to the state championship. In 1949 they made it to the semifinals before losing, and in 1953 the Mustangs were knocked off in the quarterfinals, that a 20-12 loss to Moro. This incidentally was the last time a Malin football team was beaten. The unbeaten string will be extended to 24 Saturday afternoon if Malin gets over the tough Merrill club. Only two ties in the past two years has kept Malin from a perfect goal on the gridiron.

Keck's Huskies have picked up victories over Chiloquin, Talent, Bonanza, Rogue River and Sacred Heart, while losing once to Henley. Malin has dumped Bonanza, Sacred Heart, KUH's Jayvees, Chiloquin and tied with Henley. The comparative scores between Chiloquin the third place team in the league standings finds Malin with a 21-0 win, and Merrill on the long end of a 7-0 count.

Malin is expected to start with Stu Miller at quarterback, Allen Myers at fullback, and Dale Rajnos and Melvin Kenyon at the two halfback posts. The starting line for Malin will find either Dale Rick, Ken Weatherby or Jim Tofell at end, Len Dobry and Richard Steyskal at tackle, Farrell Wilson and Denny Holl at guard, and Ron Kalina at center. Malin's line will average about 183 pounds, with Dobry at 215, Kalina at 200 and Rick at 185 the "big" men.

Merrill's starting lineup will find Doug Everston and John Hunnicutt at the ends, Bob Loper and Bud Maupin at the tackles, J. D. McMurtry and Bill Moore at the guards, and Roger Trotman at center. In the Merrill backfield, John Haskins will be at one halfback spot, with either Parry Laney or Bill Danosky at the other. Tommy O'Neil will hold down the quarterback slot, while big John Reed will be at fullback. Merrill's line will be quite a bit lighter than Malin, as it will average about 150 pounds, spotting the Mustangs about 33 pounds per man. Reed at 182 pounds is Merrill's heaviest starter, and Trotman is the heaviest Merrill lineman in the offensive line at 165 pounds.

SOC's Seymour Nation's Leader

KANSAS CITY (AP) — The NAIA statistical bureau reported Thursday that Southern Oregon College quarterback Bill Seymour leads the nation's small college football players in passing and in total offense.

He has a total offense average of 163.5 yards and has completed 45 out of 109 passes for a four-game average of 129.3 yards. Bob Webb of St. Ambrose College is second in passing with 43 completions in 84 tosses for a 127.3 average in four games.

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Jon Arnett To Play Final Tilt Saturday

LOS ANGELES (AP) — University of Southern California halfback Jon Arnett bids a mid-season adieu Saturday to a brilliant collegiate career.

"Sure, I'm a little bitter—who wouldn't be," said the "five-game" senior.

"But I can't complain. I've played a lot."

He certainly has, 25 games in which he has gained 1,781 yards to place behind Orv Mohler and Gus Shaver as the third greatest ground gainer in Troy's long and brilliant football history.

"Arnett is the best all around back I've ever coached," Trojan Coach Jess Hill said as he watched the 185-pounder scamper in a practice scrum for his finale with Stanford Saturday at Palo Alto.

Arnett has a better sense of balance than Frank Gifford (now with the New York Giants in the National Football League), Hill said, and he is just as fast as Jimmy Sears, a USC standout of 1952.

Unlike Arnett, Hill is more than a little bitter when he talks about the widely criticized Pacific Coast Conference edict limiting Arnett—and 11 other Trojan seniors—to five games this season. The ban, which also hit UCLA hard, was for allegedly accepting more financial aid than the conference allows.

"It's a travesty of justice," Hill said, "to take something from these kids for which they have worked so hard."

After the PCC crackdown, sports writers wondered whether Arnett, like UCLA's Ronnie Knox, might be lured by Canadian gold. But he turned down a Canadian offer of more than \$16,000 and remained at USC.

"I've been a Trojan fan all my

life," said 21-year-old Arnett, who was sneaking in to watch USC practices even before his all-city days at Los Angeles' Manual Arts High School.

It's no secret on the campus that Arnett has a handsome offer to become part of a Los Angeles brokerage firm after graduation next February. This he intends to do—after a fling at professional football.

While he will miss USC's traditional battles with UCLA and Notre Dame, Arnett isn't hanging up his cleats after the Stanford game.

"I'll keep working out with the team," he said. "I like being part of the squad and, besides, I have to keep in shape—there's still the East-West game this December in San Francisco."
