

Sooners, Bruins NEA Grid Pick

Ordinarily, you would not wager against a down-trodden Notre Dame squad with Oklahoma coming to South Bend with a record 34 straight.

With Irish varieties of many other autumn, this would be a perfect spot for an upset, with traditional Notre Dame tight sweeping the Celts on from behind.

But by now it is crystal clear to even the sturdiest-eyed synthetic alumni that Notre Dame is in for its worst peace-time year.

Notre Dame has been plagued by no fewer than 17 separate injuries, forcing harassed Terry Brennan to employ sophomores at the ends and tackles, where games are won.

The Celts have a tremendous back in Paul Hornung, but not nearly enough speed in the line to go with him.

Oklahoma perhaps has even more over-all speed than Michigan State, and Notre Dame's present lowly estate won't cause the Sooners to employ sophomores at the ends and tackles, where games are won.

If every Notre Dame athlete in the sick bay responded to treatment by Saturday, which they definitely will not, a Knute Rockne-type pep talk would not bring the current Celts up to anything approaching the Sooners. ND simply hasn't enough good players, so is in for another smacking, say 34-14.

While not even the world champion longshot stabber would select Notre Dame over Oklahoma, this one is giving you two in other sections. We're picking Stanford and its matchless passer, John Brodie, to deal Southern California, Jon Arnett, C. R. Roberts and all, its first defeat in Palo Alto, 27-21.

And because Texas A. and M. is likely to suffer a letdown after having been so high against Texas Christian, we're stringing with unbeaten Baylor at Waco, 14-7.

In the Midwest, there are contests vastly superior to the Oklahoma - Notre Dame mismatch, which will be seen by millions on television. Ohio State will resume steamrolling against Wisconsin, 20-7.

Purdue will drop Iowa from the all-conquering ranks, 20-19. Michigan State will roll on at

Illinois, 35-12; Michigan against Minnesota, 21-13.

Tulane has a sleight-of-hand quarterback in Gene Newton and a lot of other stuff, but Georgia Tech has numbers to the extent of 27-6. Clemson gets a shaky 14-6 call over South Carolina in that annual game played on Thursday. Duke hasn't fared too well, which is why we suspect the Blue Devils will shade North Carolina State. Florida is too strong for Louisiana State and Maryland gets it again at Tennessee.

Lopez Said Next Leader For Chicago

CHICAGO (AP) — There was a wave of speculation today as to Marty Marion's successor as manager of the Chicago White Sox but the No. 1 candidate appeared to be Al Lopez.

Marion resigned yesterday after a conference at Comiskey Park with Vice President Chuck Comiskey and other Sox brass.

"They were not happy with my work," said Marty, who moved up from the Sox coaching ranks to replace Paul Richards as Sox skipper Sept. 14, 1954.

There was little doubt that the 39-year-old former St. Louis Cardinal star shortstop stepped down under pressure.

"There were some statements made during the season by Chuck Comiskey that 'White Sox material was excellent' and that he was doing a 'creditable job,'" said Marion. "Their remarks always were just lukewarm. They never gave me a solid vote of confidence. Actually, I believe I did a good job (the Sox finished third both years under Marion). In fact, I'm proud of the job I did."

Marion, who was the 13th Sox manager since the club last won the pennant in 1919, said he had no definite plans but wanted to remain in baseball. He left Chicago immediately for his St. Louis home.

Benson, Lincoln Vie For State Berth

One berth in the Oregon class A-1 high school championship football playoffs will be cinched Friday night, and there are a number of other crucial games.

Benson, No. 19 in the Associated Press poll, meets Lincoln in a contest that will determine one of the Portland city league's two entries in the playoffs. Each has a perfect record in league play and the winner will be favored to win the city title.

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Gresham, No. 3 in the poll, and Astoria, No. 8, clash in a game that will have an important bearing on the district 3 outcome. Each is unbeaten and tied in six games. Beaverton, ranked sixth in the poll, and undefeated Parkrose, play in another vital district 3 game.

McMinnville, No. 4, is expected to advance another step toward the district 4 title by defeating Oregon City. McMinnville also has a perfect six-game mark.

Grants Pass, No. 9, will seek to preserve a perfect district 6 record when it meets Klamath Falls. Medford, No. 2, which will play Grants Pass next week, is expected to have an easy time with Ashland.

Seventh-ranked Albany must defeat North Salem to keep its championship hopes alive in district 8.

Unrated Pendleton, heavily favored to retain its district 7 title, plays Baker. Other district action has La Grande vs. Hermiston and The Dalles vs. Milton-Freewater.

Marshfield, the state's No. 1 team, plays out of its district against a strong Prineville team.

Eugene, No. 6, goes Saturday night against North Bend.

Other Friday night action includes Springfield vs. Roseburg, West Linn vs. Newberg, Bend vs. Redmond, Lebanon vs. Sweet Home, Tigard vs. Lake Oswego and Central Catholic vs. Hillsboro.

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
