# President Again Replies To Demo H-Bomb Charge

President Eisenhower said last night "the compelling challenge before the world is not the matter of testing nuclear weapons—but of making impossible their use in nuclear war."

Thus, in a speech to a cheering crowd packed into New York's Madison Square Garden, did Eisenhower reply once again to Adlai E. Stevenson's oft-repeated proposal that the United States take the lead in seeking world agreement to end hydrogen bomb tests. Stevenson, the Democratic presidential candidate, set aside his H-bomb proposal for the time being last night as he pounded at Eisenhower for what he said is "a record of calloused political perfidy" on farm promises.

Speaking in Springfield, Ill., Stevenson leveled criticism at Eisenhower personally, saying the President has compounded "deceit with self-righteous hypocrisy."

Immediately after his speech in New York, Eisenhower flew back to Washington, where he planned to devote his day to White House tasks.

Eisenhower got heavy applause when he said the United States stands in "instant readiness to lay aside all nuclear weapons—including their testing—when, but only when, we have safeguards that others will do the same."

The President also undertook to reply to Stevenson's contention that the GOP administration has been sterile of new ideas.

Eisenhower said that when the Republicans came to power in 1953 they found what he described as "a number of old ideas for whose energetic application the American people had waited all too long." Among these, he listed reduction of federal spending, taxes and unemployment.

Stevenson's speech dealt mainly with the farm problem. After a conference with his running mate Sen. Estes Kefauver, Stevenson announced at a rally that, if elected, he plans "to explore at once the appointment of a task force to put the Democratic farm program in shape for swift action at the opening of Congress." He said Kefauver would head the task force.

Stevenson said, "We must protect the family farm and help the low-income farmer—those people the President says he loves and his appointees say should be plowed under."

The Democratic candidate said his party does not regard fixed, high-level farm price supports as "the last and only word," but the

"beginning of the path to a good farm policy."
