Judge Views Court Agendas

Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg, write-in candidate for supreme court justice, said Thursday he does not agree that the backlog of cases in the high court creates a complicated problem.
"That condition results from the increased population of the state," he added. "When one considers that several additional circuit court positions have been created in the past 20 years, but no justices have been added to the supreme court, it is not surprising that a bottleneck exists."
"I believe that with good hard work and added help the difficulty could be remedied," the judge concluded. "Because of the present temporary congested condition of the court, no litigant should forfeit any rights or consideration formerly had in the supreme court."
