

Linn, Lane Demos Sure Of Election Day Victory

EUGENE (AP)—Republican leaders, worried over Doug McKay's prospects, are confident that the other Republican candidates will carry Linn and Lane counties.

Their gloom about McKay's prospects has lessened some as they feel that the former secretary of the interior is gaining fast. But the Democrats, who have made big registration gains in these two areas, say they'll win everything.

Ed Boehne, owner of a Eugene printing firm, used to be Republican state chairman and now is a precinct committeeman. What he says is typical of what Republicans throughout the state are hoping.

"Morse reached his peak two weeks ago," Boehne said, "and McKay is gaining fast. All of the other Republicans are in good shape."

Albany and Eugene are Republican, but the rest of Linn and Lane counties is Democratic.

While registration figures aren't the final answer by any means, they do tell a story, especially as far as new registrations are concerned.

In Linn County, since the May primary, the Democrats picked up 2,200 registrations, and the Republicans 1,200. In new registrations in Lane County, the Democrats held a 7,400 to 3,900 edge.

As in other places, the Democrats are working harder than the Republicans. Dave Averill, political writer for the Eugene Register-Guard, reports that the Republicans want McKay to come back to Eugene and campaign some more.

Averill says the conservation issue has cost McKay some votes. He, and others who were contacted, predict that Morse will carry the county. In Linn County, it looks also as though Morse has a small edge now.

Illustrating the fact that Morse supporters are fervent in his home city, the Register-Guard reports its mail is running 5 to 1 for Morse.

Bob Frazier, the newspaper's associate editor, says "Morse is doing a tremendous grass roots job, and he's reaching the people."

Both Morse and McKay have used the coffee hour method of campaigning to advantage. In Linn County, a Republican political writer said "Morse sure enchants the ladies at these coffees."

Congressman Harris Ellsworth, Roseburg Republican who has served since the Fourth District was created in 1943, has a tough challenger in Charles Porter, Eugene lawyer, who lost to Ellsworth two years ago by 15,000 votes.

Porter, a close ally of Sen. Morse and Neuberger, has worked the Al Sarena mining issue hard. Since there's a question whether the state House of Representatives will go Democratic for the first time since 1937, the legislative races in Lane County take on importance.

The county has five representatives, and all are Republicans. If the Democrats pick up six more seats, they would have control of the 60-member House.

There is a good chance that the Democrats might gain two seats here, their best possibilities being Glen M. Stadler, widely known Springfield radio newsman, and Keith D. Skelton, Eugene lawyer and close ally of Porter.

In both counties, labor unions are working hard for the Democrats, although several sources in Albany predicted that some labor support would go for the Republicans.
