Jacque Colton of Medford has been elected to compete in the Pacific Northwest contest for a chance to go to the National Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y Congress to be held in December. Also, Estelline Kiger and Lloyd Seely were elected as representative and alternate respectively to serve a district council.

They were chosen at the Southern Oregon leadership institute held here recently, at the YMCA building for delegates from Medford, Ashland, Grants Pass and Klamath Falls.

Opening with a general assembly, Monte Voight, master of ceremonies, asked for introductions. Estelline Kiger, council president, welcomed institute members.

First was a filmstrip entitled "Who is Thy Neighbor?" Bill Cornell, YMCA secretary, mentioned what the local clubs were doing for world service this year.

"Getting Our Bearings" was the title of the first session of the day. Rating scales were filled out and tabulated to study club effectiveness. A filmstrip was shown on "What is Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y?"

Three clubs were formed with an adviser. Developing programs from goals and interests of all groups took two workshop sessions.

Entertainment after dinner was provided by Mona Chenoweth who sang "Happiness Street," and a trio composed of Mary Nell Laurhammer, Sharon Powell, and Serena Smith, who sang "Angry" and "Blue Skies." Pat Wilson of Grants Pass talked of her visit to Camp Silver Creek at regional leadership institute this summer.

Mrs. William Long then gave "The Thought For Today." Medford will be hosts next year.

Burns Fatal For Fireman

COTTAGE GROVE — The first death in the fire and explosion that wrecked the Cottage Grove Gas Co. plant a week ago was recorded Sunday night.

Wayne F. McCall, 29-year-old volunteer fireman, died of burns in a Cottage Grove hospital.

McCall was one of four Cottage Grove volunteers critically burned. Only one, Harold Dean, now remains on the critical list.

The others, John McKy and Lynn Wilson, are reported in fair condition.

Several state agencies are still investigating the fire and explosions which burned or injured some 22 persons.

McCall is survived by his mother and father, Mr. and Mrs. John McCall of Cottage Grove, and has five brothers and sisters living in the state.

Murder Count Faces Man

THE DALLES, Ore. — Eugene C. Hatch, 20, Yakima, faces a murder charge in the slaying 13 days ago of a 76-year-old businessman from Montana, Walter Freeborn of Great Falls.

The charge was filed Saturday, a day after Hatch had been returned here from Yakima. He waived a preliminary hearing in Justice Court and was ordered held for the grand jury.

Wasco County Dist. Atty. Don Heisler quoted Hatch as saying he stabbed Freeborn Oct. 13 after a quarrel in the victim's trailer house here. On Thursday night, Heisler added, Hatch led Yakima County officials to Freeborn's grave 23 miles south of Toppenish, Wash.

Later the bloodstained house trailer was found near Yakima and authorities had it in storage, then it burned. Yakima County is holding David Kardack, 22, Yakima, in connection with the trailer fire.

Eight Fugitives Burrow Through Jail Wall To Freedom In Nevada

RENO (UP) — Nevada and California authorities watched trans-Sierra highways today for eight fugitives who escaped from Washoe County jail here by burrowing through a crumbling brick wall with broken shower pipes.

The fugitives were all awaiting trial on federal or state offenses. Eight other prisoners chose to remain in jail while the escape took place before dawn Sunday.

HONOLULU — Japanese Prime Minister Ichiro Hatoyama arrived last night en route home from Moscow, where he negotiated a Japanese-Russian peace treaty.

false pretenses; Edward J. Jennings, 21, Peoria, Ill., accused of obtaining money under false pretenses; Owen Burkhardt, 27, McMinnville, Ore., armed robbery; Charles E. Thomas alias Chester Sizemore, 20, Auburn, Wash., and Alex Robert Kessack, 19, Seattle, auto theft across a state line.

Sheriff C. W. Young said the inmates broke shower pipes from the wall and used them to dig a hole about 14 inches square through a brick wall at the rear of the jail.

"It's old time mortar with no cement," Young said. "You could dig it out with a spoon."

Using ropes made from their blankets, the eight lowered themselves to an exercise yard, then tossed the blankets over the outside wall for a ladderway.

Young said he believed the fugitives scattered almost immediately. Later, a car stolen in Reno turned up in Carson City, where some of the jailbreakers apparently stole another car.

He ordered a check of all highways leading across the Sierra into California in belief the Cali-

forians at least might try to head for home.

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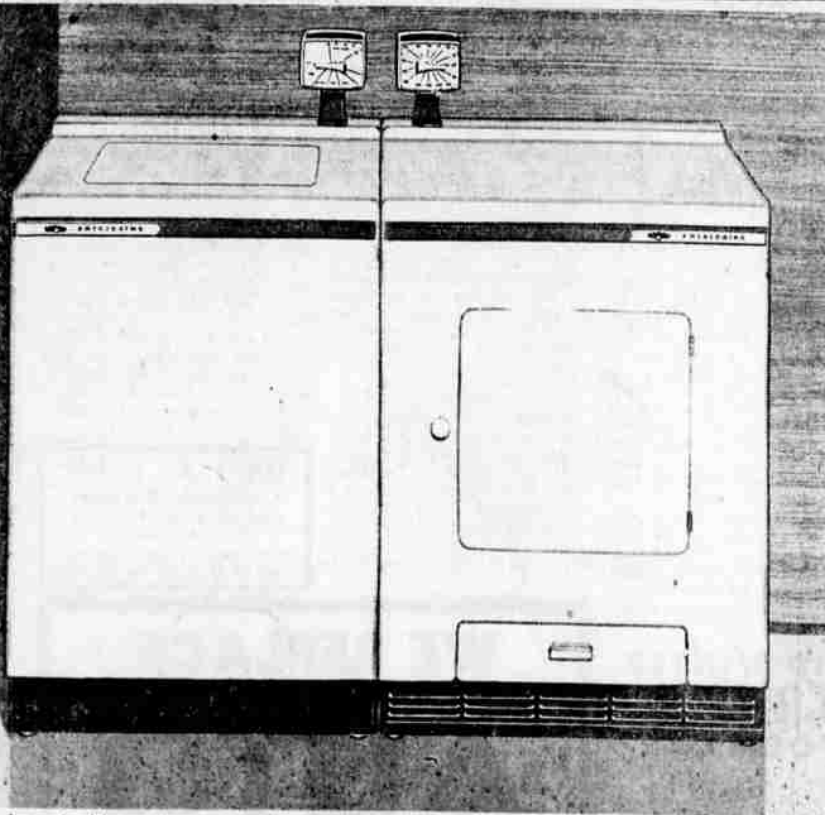
