Vernon School Bids Heard

LAKEVIEW — Three bids were received by Lake County School District No. 41, Lakeview, at the bid opening Friday afternoon for a two-classroom addition to Vernon Elementary School, five miles west of Lakeview.

Because a quorum was lacking, official action was not taken Friday. Another meeting has been called for this week to consider the bids.

Bidders and amounts of bids were: Mann Construction Company, Redmond, \$30,600; Lakeview Building Materials Company, Lakeview, \$31,150, and A. E. Fitzgerald, Klamath Falls, \$34,649.

The one-story addition will contain 3200 square feet. Construction will be reinforced concrete

footings and foundation, concrete floor, frame walls, built-up composition roof, frame partitions, wood windows, vinyl asbestos tile flooring, acoustical ceilings and plasterboard interior.

Morrison and Howard, Klamath Falls, were architects.

LAKEVIEW — Lake County Judge C. H. Langslet moved date to November 12 and 13 the date for the meeting of the tax committee of the Association of Oregon Counties. The meeting was originally scheduled for Tuesday, October 23, at Lakeview, but the first snow storm of the winter made some of the members in the western section of the state decide against the trip at this time.

The location of the meeting is also changed in that it will be held in Portland on the two days previous to the state association convention on November 14, 15 and 16.

LAKEVIEW — Services will be held at 2 p.m., Tuesday, from the Elks Lodge, with the Rev. C. Wayne Julier officiating, for Leonard Earl Hawk, 49, who died at his West Side home on Saturday. He had been ill for about a year.

Born at Crawfordville, Oregon, he lived at Falls City in Polk County prior to coming to Lake County. He was a logger, rancher and at one time a forest service employe. For the last 15 years he had been ranching on the Dry Creek section of Goose Lake Valley.

Survivors include the widow, Virginia Ellen Hawk of Lakeview; two sons, Ronald Hawk, a student at Oregon State College and James who attend Lakeview High School; his father, William Hawk of Portland; three sisters, Mrs. Violette Leih of Willow Ranch, Mrs. Ray Roberts of Portland and Mrs. Juanita Schuler of Salem.

He was a member of the Dry Creek school board and of the Elks Lodge.
