

AP's All-Star Team Led By Junior Loop

NEW YORK (AP) — A heavy-hitting major league all-star team, led by Mickey Vernon, Ted Williams and Yogi Berra, Tuesday was selected by members of the Baseball Writers' Assn. of America in the annual Associated Press poll.

The powerful array was backed up by Brooklyn righthander Don Newcombe and Billy Pierce, Chicago White Sox lefthander, who drew a majority of the votes cast for pitchers.

Mantle, the American League leader in home runs (52), runs batted in (130) and batting average (.353) was named to an outfield spot on 202 of the 205 ballots.

Timer Arrives For Meet

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — The Olympics streamlined "Fathertime" reached Melbourne Tuesday ready for the games starting Nov. 22.

Five hundred pieces of highly specialized timing equipment have come with him.

Eventually, Sicker will be joined by nine experts who will help in timing the games.

A clock camera is their greatest pride. Developed specially for the Helsinki games, it automatically photographs each contestant in the race finish and records his time to one hundredth of a second.

"But even split second timing like that is becoming out of date," said Sicker. "In Switzerland, we are experimenting with a machine seeking accuracy to one ten thousandth part of a second. If perfected, it could be used to time anything from flies crawling up a wall to jet bombers."

The Olympic village got a fine endorsement when Australian distance runners Dave Stephens and Merr Lincoln made a tour.

Both liked it so much they were back two hours later with their luggage. They say the food, rooms and service all are excellent.

Stephens and Lincoln are the first Australians to move in.

Greek pole vaulter George Roubanis also put on an exhibition of vaulting which left the Australians impressed. Roubanis had not intended to jump because the ground was wet from rain but he agreed to perform for photographers.

On the first jump he cleared 13 feet 3 inches, just 4 inches short of the Australian record.

The 27-year-old Roubanis is rated as the best Greek hope for the gold medal in the Olympics. He has cleared 14-6 in America and just before coming to Australia beat world champion Bob Richards in a competition.

This was the first appearance on a training track in Australia for Roubanis.

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Dodd Gives Credit To GT Linemen

ATLANTA (AP) — Georgia Tech's terrific backs have been getting most of the credit for moving the Ramblin' Wrecks into the No. 2 spot among the nation's football powers. But Coach Bobby Dodd is just as proud of his oft-overlooked line.

"We've got some fine backs, certainly," Dodd said today, "probably the finest group of backs I've ever had at one time. But they wouldn't be going great guns as they are if we didn't have some pretty good boys up front."

Looking back on the Tulane game while getting ready for Saturday's date with Duke in Durham, Dodd kept talking about his team's blocking at the line of scrimmage.

"We've been getting good downfield blocking all along, but I was really proud of the way our boys blocked on the line against Tulane," he said. "They were opening holes big enough for anybody to run through."

On defense, Dodd was particularly proud of Jimmy Johnson, a roving guard who racked up Tulane ball carriers all day, and center Don Stephenson, who turned in his usual fine job of linebacking.

Dodd said Johnson played one of the finest defensive games at guard he has seen in a long time and he rates Stephenson as one of the finest he's ever had — which includes All America Larry Morris and All Conference George Morris.

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Taylor Says LA Worried

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Chuck Taylor says Red Sanders and his UCLA Bruins are "very conscious" of his Stanford Indians and their game Saturday in Los Angeles.

How does he know? His scouting reports reveal the secret, the Stanford coach told football writers Monday. The reports, he said, noted that some of UCLA's best "played little or not as much as usual" in their 21-7 loss to Oregon State.

Queried on that, Taylor speculated "undoubtedly Sanders just wanted to give his reserves some game experience."

"Nevertheless, Sanders and UCLA seem very conscious of Stanford."

After the Pacific Coast Conference fined and disciplined UCLA and three other schools, Stanford did not endeavor itself to them when it voted to sustain rather than reduce the penalties.

Taylor said UCLA presents a confusing problem because the Bruins "continue to improve." He called Stanford's Saturday 27-19 win over Southern California a "pleasant" victory, but said "technically we didn't play a good game defensively."

California's Pappy Waldorf credited a much improved defense for the Bears' 16-7 win over Washington.

Never the optimist, the portly mentor described his upcoming opponent, Oregon, as "an extremely dangerous club — a team that has had bad fortune."

"Our original feeling about the Ducks is unchanged. They are extremely dangerous, particularly on such things as punt returns and kickoffs because of their speedy backs."

Oregon's publicist, Art Litchman commented: "Basically we're the same team that beat Cal 21-0 last year. Our trouble has been with our tackles. Inexperience and injury at those positions has hurt us."

The Washington game cost Waldorf end Norm Becker but he said he was "particularly pleased with end Ron Wheatcroft's development."

Waldorf was happy with the quarterbacking of Joe Kapp, a sophomore third stringer until injuries hit Gus Gianullas and Joe Contestabile.

VIENNA (UP) — Radio Budapest announced Monday night that Gustav Sebes, Hungarian vice-sports minister, would not accompany the country's Olympic team to Melbourne. The broadcast said Sebes, a Stalinist, and 10 others had been cancelled from the original list of 46 officials scheduled to fly to Melbourne.

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (UP) — Archie Moore, world light heavyweight champion, said today he planned to continue training at his nearby Ramona Camp for about two more weeks before switching to Chicago to taper off for his heavyweight title bout with Floyd Patterson Nov. 30 at Chicago Stadium.

NEW YORK (UP) — The International Boxing Club has announced that tickets for the Dec. 12 Ray Robinson - Gene Fullmer world middleweight bout at Madison Square Garden will go on sale at the arena Nov. 12 and will be scaled from \$4 to \$30.

CLEVELAND (UP) — The Cleveland Indians announced today they will raise their box seat prices from \$2.25 to \$2.50 and reserved seats from \$1.85 to \$1.75 for the 1957 season. General admission (\$1.25) and bleacher seats (\$1.00) remain the same.

Chicago White Sox Sign Lopez To 1-Year Managerial Contract

CHICAGO (AP) — Al Lopez, ex-Cleveland manager who made a career of finishing second to the New York Yankees, and the perennial third-place Chicago White Sox, joined forces yesterday.

Lopez accepted a one-year contract offered by Vice President Chuck Comiskey to manage the White Sox in 1957. Lopez resigned as Cleveland manager Sept. 29 after guiding the Tribe to second place five times since 1951.

The Tribe won the pennant under Lopez in 1954 with an American League record of 111 victories.

Lopez, one of baseball's "nice guy" managers, succeeds Marty Marion, who bowed out last week as manager of the White Sox.

Meanwhile, Cleveland boss Hank Greenberg went to Los Angeles to talk with Leo Durocher, former manager of the New York Giants. Durocher, who once said "Nice guys don't win pennants," has indicated he'll manage Cleveland if the price is right.

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
