• WORLD PEACE

Sam has received the personal endorsement of President Eisenhower, who ended the war and brought lasting peace. Sam supported the Farman resolution, which gave Ike the strong hand he needed to stop the Chinese Communists. Sam will continue to support Ike's firm policies to prevent Communist aggression throughout the world.

• FREE ENTERPRISE

Sam is aware that the free enterprise system of government is what has made America strong and prosperous. He knows that undue government competition kills initiative and slows down the economy. Therefore, he always will work to see that free enterprise is preserved and encouraged, so that America continues to progress.

• FARM POLICY

Sam supports the realistic soil bank plan, which already is cutting down on price-depressing surpluses. He backs the Eisenhower administration in its efforts to increase exports and domestic consumption through distribution of farm products to needy families. He will seek to give the farmer more freedom and a fair return on an open market.

• FEDERAL AID to EDUCATION

Sam voted for federal aid when no federal controls were involved. He supported aid to federally impacted areas. He also voted to give \$3,800,000 to the Oregon schools under a plan to return 1 percent of the federal income tax collections directly to the state. He knows that the people want to retain control over their local schools, and he will continue to vote accordingly.

• FEDERAL SPENDING

Sam has worked for economy in government throughout his four years in Congress. The November issue of Reader's Digest tells how he and two other Congressmen saved the taxpayers over \$6,000,000 through an investigation in 1952. Sam will continue to seek more efficiency and less waste in government.

• TAXES

Sam voted for tax revisions in 1954 which resulted in a saving of about \$200 for each American family of four. He knows that still lower taxes are possible if we keep a balanced budget and continue to reduce federal spending. Additional tax cuts will be more than a promise with men like Sam in Congress.

• POWER DEVELOPMENT

Sam helped his district and adjoining ones get over \$52,000,000, or almost \$1 of every \$16 appropriated for public works in the entire country this year. But he realizes that this is

not enough, and that we must obtain financial cooperation from local public and private groups to meet growing power needs and avoid shortages. Sam will continue his efforts to

get the most power in the shortest time possible. He knows that an all-federal-or-nothing approach is not the answer.
