revealed Wednesday. Instead of averaging 439.5 yards per game on total offense, the Sooners are down to a 414.6 yard average. And their rushing rate tumbled from 396.5 yards to 346.6 per game.

STILL GOOD
Both those figures still are good enough to lead all the major colleges. Only Navy, with 404.6 yards per game, is above the 400 yard mark and Southern California with 314.8 yards average, is the only other one above 300 by rushing.

The University of Washington Huskies are seventh in the nation in rushing, with a per game average of 281.2 yards gained on the ground in six contests.

Navy, Notre Dame's next opponent, gained 488 yards against Penn to move up from seventh to second in offense. The Midshipmen also are fifth in the passing department.

In the air, Washington State, 234.0 yards per game, and Stanford, 203.0, are the only teams to gain more than 200 yards a game by passing. They're staging a private duel for the title of the passing-best team.

Washington State's Cougars have thrown 189 passes and completed 9 for 1,404 yards. Stanford has made good on 103 out of 188 for 1,218 yards. Rice is the most accurate throwing team with 45 of 76 for a .592 completion average.

PASSING ATTACK
Largely on the basis of their passing attack, the Cougars hold down the No. 4 spot in total offense with 385.2 yards gained a game in six contests.

Oklahoma, basically a running team, hasn't slowed down in scoring. Its average is 44.2 points a game, almost ten points higher than Arizona State's.

Army ran and passed for 640 yards—475 of them on the ground—in its 60-0 rout of Columbia last Saturday and advanced from 43rd to seventh in total offense and from 25th to fourth in rushing.

Clemson didn't throw a pass in its game against South Carolina last week, the first time a major team has done that since 1952.

New Meeting Set By Big Ten Leaders
CHICAGO (UP) — A special Big Ten committee working on details of a new conference athletic code ended a two-day meeting Tuesday and scheduled another conference for Nov. 19.

Bill Reed, assistant commissioner of the Western Conference and an ex-officio member of the special committee, said the group needs more work to complete the "vast and complicated" details of the proposed plan.

There was no announcement as to any headway the committee had made in drafting legislation which would standardize aid to conference athletes on the basis of need.

However, the plans must be ready for consideration at the Dec. 3-8 Big Ten meetings, which also will be held in Chicago.

The proposed new code was a direct result of a recent Big Ten report which said the present conference "offer" program for athletes was an invitation to "hypocrisy and deceit."

Also to be acted upon at the December meetings is a proposal that would lead to a round-robin football schedule. Under the plan, all teams will play 10 games, seven against conference foes, in 1959-60. Eight of the 10 games in 1961-62 would be conference games and a full 9-game round-robin thereafter with one outside game.

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Chuck Taylor Apologizes; Red Sanders Warns Stanford Team

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Coach Taylor apologized to Sanders for telling Northern California football writers that UCLA did not play its top men as much as usual against Oregon State.

He denied he meant to imply "anything out of the ordinary as far as the UCLA-Oregon State game was concerned. It was certainly not my intention to reflect discredit on UCLA. I hope Coach Sanders believes my statements indicated this... and will accept my apology."

"This only gives UCLA players something to hang on the bulletin board," Taylor added.
"Stop Brodie" was the watchword as the Bruins concentrated on passing defense for their Los Angeles meeting with Stanford, Quarterback John Brodie is Stanford's No. 1 threat and the nation's leading passer. Sanders indicated he planned to rush Brodie

with his middle linemen while displaying his ends to protect against flat passes.

CONTACT WORK
Taylor drilled the Indians on tackling and defenses against UCLA in the team's only scheduled contact workout this week. End Gary Van Galder, injured early in the season, was moved up to the first team ahead of Ben Robinson. John Clark took over at left guard from injured Donn Carswell.

Southern California's remaining five-game seniors went through their first scrimmage as regulars as the Trojans readied for Washington State at Pullman. Guard Laird Willett and tackle Ron Fletcher and Dick Enright looked good as did quarterback Ellis Kissinger and halfback Jim Decker.

The California Golden Bears stressed offense for their meeting with Oregon at Berkeley. The 2½ hour scrimmage was one of the longest of the season.

Oregon State, still elated after its victory over UCLA, worked on passing for the Beavers' conference crucial with Washington. Coach Tommy Prothro warned his club not to take Washington lightly or to look ahead to Stanford the following week.

RUSH DEFENSE
At Seattle, Coach Darrell Royal gave his Washington Huskies a long workout on rush defense and ball handling, particularly on that phase of handling in which the oval is retained by the carrier. The Huskies fumbled the ball away six times in their 16-7 loss to California last Saturday.

Lippy Quiet On Return To Baseball
LOS ANGELES (UP) — Leo Durocher was anything but lippy Wednesday about any offer he may have to return to baseball and manage the Cleveland Indians.

"Any statement will have to come from Hank Greenberg," said the former New York Giant manager, who met twice Tuesday with Greenberg, the Indians' general manager.

Greenberg, visiting here with his friend and former Pittsburgh Pirate teammate, Ralph Kiner, was not available for comment. Kiner is now general manager of the Indians' San Diego farm club.

A reliable source told The Associated Press that Durocher, now an NBC executive, was offered a fat salary to take over the Indians, who finished second last season in the American League. But, the source said, Greenberg balked when Durocher also demanded a sizable hunk of the club's stock.

Durocher has said previously he would never manage again "just for a salary."

After Tuesday's first meeting at the Beverly Hills Hotel, Durocher told newsmen he had to talk to his wife, actress Laraine Day, and several NBC officials.

"We were both sounding each other out," Greenberg said after the first meeting. "I want to find out first whether Leo is really interested and if he is, we'll go on from there."

SAME POSITION
LARAMIE, Wyo. (UP) — There's brotherly love among two candidates for the tailback job on the University of Wyoming football team. Jim Crawford, a two-year veteran from Greybull, Wyo., is the leading candidate for the post. Some of his toughest competition comes from his young brother, Jerry, a 165-pound sophomore.

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
