Driver Faces Reckless Charge

Failure to get in his car in time resulted in the filing of a reckless driving charge against John Lind of Klamath Falls Tuesday afternoon.

Lind's vehicle was parked on the curb on the south side of Second Street near the Pine Street intersection. The battery was down and Lind told police he pushed it into the street with hopes of starting it when it began rolling down hill. The car began rolling down Second as planned . . . but so

fast that Lind was unable to get into it.

The pilotless machine went about a quarter-block down the steeply inclined Second Street, crashed into the rear of a parked car owned by Sid Sabado of Klamath Falls. The Sabado car was in turn pushed into the rear of a car parked next to it. The second parked car is owned by Art Bessonen of Klamath Falls.

The rear portions of both machines were slightly damaged, with the front of Lind's car being slightly banged up.

WAYNE MORSE GETS THINGS DONE FOR THE FAMILY FARMER

Senator Wayne Morse persuaded Congress this Spring to pass the Domestic Parity Plan for wheat which was endorsed by the Oregon Wheat League. Domestic Parity helps the wheat grower and lowers feed prices for poultrymen and cattlemen. The plan died when President Eisenhower vetoed the 1956 Farm Bill.

Wayne Morse won increased sugar beet quotas in the 1956 Sugar Act which he co-sponsored.

Senator Wayne Morse will continue to work for protection of Oregon fruit tree crops.

Senator Morse improved the 1956 Farm bill to include specific benefits for family farmers. One improvement was a provision insuring that farmers, not processors, would benefit from the support price on meat purchased by the government.

This July, Senator Wayne Morse was commended by the National Milk Producers Federation for his work on behalf of dairymen.

Senator Wayne Morse is urging government purchase of small and low grade potatoes for non-food use to prevent a price collapse in the potato market.

Wayne Morse has fought the Administration's hard money policy which has tightened credit and forced up interest rates for the farmer during these years when loans are desperately needed.

New Anderson Appeal Possible

Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg late Tuesday signed a bill of exceptions to his ruling against James Quinton Anderson, convicted murderer, which paves the way for a new defense appeal to the Oregon Supreme Court.

The document was presented to the court by Attorney Robert Welch of Lakeview, one of Anderson's three lawyers. The defense

now has 30 days in which to file a brief stating its position with the supreme court.

Anderson, sentenced to life imprisonment for the shotgun slaying of Richard David Miller, Klamath Reservation horse breeder, was transferred last week from Klamath County Jail to Oregon State Prison.
