Nevada Hunt Charge Set

RENO (UP)—Santa Rosa businessman Charles Townsend was ordered today to appear before Justice of the Peace William R. Beemer Nov. 7 at 2 p.m. for arraignment on a charge of violating Nevada deer hunting regulations.

Townsend is free on a \$500 appearance bond posted in Elko Justice Court Oct. 22 pending trial on a charge of "willfully and unlawfully" obtaining an excessive number of nonresident hunting licenses and deer tags in Reno.

At the time he posted the appearance bond, Townsend was fined \$100 by Elko Justice of the Peace George R. Boucher for having two licenses and tags in his possession.

It was the second time he had

been fined in Elko Justice Court for a hunting violation. In 1953, he and six other Santa Rosa men were fined \$75 each for transporting outside of Nevada two and a half more deer than was allowed by state game regulations.

Fats Domino Says Rock, Roll Music Nothing New

HOLLYWOOD — From a fellow who should know comes the proposition that rock 'n' roll is neither corrupting nor new.

The source is Fats Domino, whose free-rolling, hard-bouncing records have sold in the millions. He has also made news by having riots at his concerts.

"But it wasn't the kids that did it," he said. "We've only had two incidents, and both were caused by adults who were drinking. One was in San Jose, where they packed too many people into the hall. The kids were okay, but a lot of the grownups were boozing. Somebody threw a bottle on the floor and then some others did. Somebody called the cops."

"The same thing happened at the naval base in Newport, R. I. Somebody threw a bottle and the trouble started. The music had nothing to do with it."

"When we play to an audience of kids, they don't go wild. They just clap their hands to the beat and bounce a little and enjoy themselves."

He added that rock 'n' roll had gotten a bad name with adults because some entertainers employ dirty lyrics and suggestive movements. "I don't think they're doing it so much any more," he said.

"I never would use dirty lyrics. And I don't use body movements either. I just play the piano or I sing and clap my hands."

Domino is 28 and built like his namesake, the late Fats Waller, for whose film biography he has been mentioned. Young Fats is a New Orleans boy who made good in a big way, but it didn't happen overnight.

"I'm playing the same music

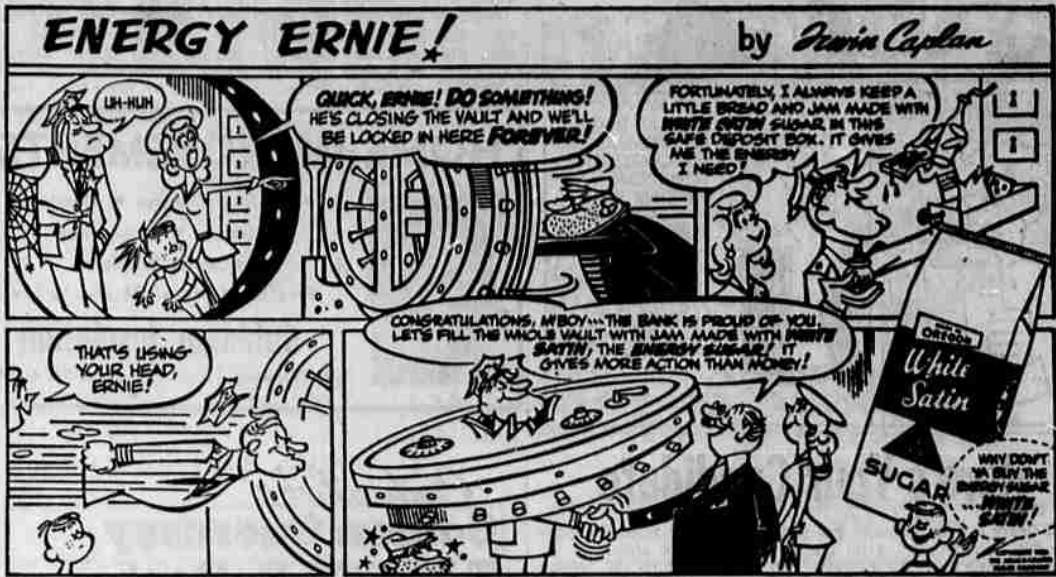
I've been playing for 15 to 16 years," he explained. "It's the same old New Orleans beat they've always played down there."

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
