Marine NCO
Found Guilty

PARRIS ISLAND, S.C. (AP)—A general court-martial has convicted a mess sergeant at this Marine Corps recruit depot of one of 12 specifications, or charges, that he struck fledgling Marines.

Sgt. Edwin Kravitz of White Plains, N.Y., was acquitted Monday of the 11 other specifications involving 22 recruits assigned to kitchen work under him on Aug. 28. The court-martial fined him \$360, to be deducted from his pay at the rate of \$90 a month.

Meanwhile, a recruit here has been fined and imprisoned for falsely accusing a drill instructor of mistreating him, and four other recruit mistreatment cases are pending, the public information office said.

Pvt. Lawrence L. Walsh of New York City was sentenced to 25 days in the brig and a \$50 fine Oct. 26 by a summary court-martial which convicted him of bringing false charges against his drill instructor.
