Mercer, local representative of West Coast Life Insurance, told representatives of Klamath Falls business firms Monday evening. Mercer was guest speaker at the 24th annual banquet of Merchants Credit Service, Inc., at the Willard Hotel. One hundred and fourteen members and guests attended.

In discussing how credit affects a community, Mercer stated that during the war there was more money in circulation than there were services and goods available.
