

### Beef Promotion Programs Outlined To Cow Belles

Two programs that are being sponsored by the Oregon Cow Belles in the overall plan of promotion of increased use of beef, were outlined by Mrs. Joe Oliver, state Cow Belle president, speaking to some 50 members of Klamath County Cow Belles and their guests at the Pelican Cafe Monday noon. The occasion was the annual fall luncheon and it marked the first time a president of the state group has attended.

Mrs. Oliver stated that Mrs. Dave Campbell of Bly, first president of the Klamath County group and now first vice president of the state organization, is general chairman for the State Cow Belles Beef Promotion Committee. Emphasis is being placed on teaching future homemakers more and better ways of using beef on the menu. To this end, the state Cow Belles are sending copies of Beef Cookery, the national Cow Belles' cookbook, to homemaking departments of high schools in counties where Cow Belles have not been organized. In addition, \$10 will be added to the food purchasing budget of each of those departments applying for it. The overall cost, Mrs. Oliver said, will be about \$1,400 in addition to the cost of the cookbooks.

### Coroner Raps Measure Four

MEDFORD — Jackson County Coroner Carlos W. Morris came out Wednesday against Measure No. 4 on the November election ballot which provides for removing coroners and surveyors in the state of Oregon from the provision of the constitution, thereby making them appointive instead of elective offices.

"This measure is misleading," he said. "I am opposed to having our officials appointive. They must remain elective. I am also opposed to the proposal that the office of attorney general be made appointive."

"Should Measure No. 4 pass," he continued, "it is quite possible that the coroner's budget for each county in the state would be increased by some \$25,000 to \$35,000 per year. At no time have police departments requested this measure. Therefore, they must be satisfied."

Morris also contends that Measure No. 4 should be defeated because it is possible, if it became effective, that all bodies coming under the coroner's jurisdiction would be subjected to autopsy, even when death was due to natural causes.
