San Francisco Bay Region: Fair today, variable cloudiness tonight and Saturday with occasional showers likely; little change in temperature; high today 63-65; low tonight 50-55; westerly winds 10-20 m.p.h.

School Finance May Face Legislators At Session

During the recent Legislative Interim Tax Committee hearing in Portland the Republican delegation presented a five-point tax program to be submitted during the special session of the Legislature which is scheduled to open the latter part of this month.

One portion of the program is designed to provide local property tax relief by having the state take over the \$10 per census child county school levy.  
With particular reference to Klamath County, Carol Howe, superintendent of schools, points out that such a move could result in the county receiving approximately \$136,000 from the state, with it then being unnecessary to raise that amount from the local level.  
In essence, the county school levies would not thereby be decreased, but the county budget levy required for raising the \$22.63 per census child in Klamath County could be lowered. If the state assumed \$10 of the \$22.63 which is currently raised on a local level, the county levy could be reduced by approximately two and one half mills on the basis that each mill raises about \$49,000.

Another portion of the five-point program would provide that business during the special session be restricted to tax relief and basic school fund legislation.  
In this category, and if the state's basic school fund contribution were modified, the amount received could be reflected in a reduction of the school levies. The present state basic-school support fund is \$95 per census child, with 80 per cent of the money being distributed to the counties on a student and teacher number basis and the remaining 20 per cent on a tax equalization basis designed to assist the less wealthy districts.  
School officials in most parts of the state have been girding for more than a month to have the basic school support fund increased during the special session, and the secretary of the Oregon Education

Association recently appeared before a Senate study group and maintained that the Legislature has obligated itself to raise the basic school support fund from the present \$95 to \$110 per census child. If the basic school support fund were raised to \$110 during the special session, and if the method of apportionment remained the same, the Klamath County schools could receive approximately \$163,872 additional in basic support funds.

The figure is based on the fact that the Klamath County per census child count for the approximate number of minors between 4 and 18 years of age has been concluded as 13,656. On the basis of distributing the state support money in the form of 80 per cent per census number, and 20 per cent for tax equalization purposes, Klamath County would receive \$12 additional for each of the 13,656 children. Inasmuch as the school districts within Klamath County are among the more wealthy in the state, the districts would receive little or none of the 20 per cent tax equalization sum.  
In the event the basic school support fund were increased, the local school district levies might then reflect a reduction accordingly. However, the rolls have been set for the 1957-58 school year, and regardless of what action the Legislature takes school-wise it is improbable that any school millage reductions will be reflected prior to the fall of 1958.

The above cited figures are in no way conclusive, and only approximate what would happen if the basic school support fund were raised and the method of apportionment remained the same.  
The possibility becomes even more uncertain when it is noted that close observers of the political scene feel that an all out effort may be launched to modify the method of apportioning school monies if the legislative gates are thrown open as a means of raising the school support figure.

Hitchcock Plans New Series Of TV Mystery Programs

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—Roly-poly Alfred Hitchcock, not content with one successful TV show and his movie director career, has launched another video spine-chiller, because "I was too polite to turn down the offer."

Sitting in his office at Paramount Studios, Hitchcock, his hands folded across his ample waist looked like a benevolent Kewpie-doll. It's been five years since he's had a vacation from his desk.  
"I don't mind the work," he said, flicking the ash from a dead cigar. "And I'm not particularly interested in a holiday. Nor am I undertaking the new show 'Suspicion' for monetary reasons. After all, I can eat only two lambchops a day."

Why, then, is the doughty director taking on an additional show? "Revue Productions asked if I would mind producing 10 shows for their program with my own unit," he explained cheerfully. "And the truth is I was too polite to refuse."  
Hitchcock was credited with having the best business deal in television. After the first showing of each of his programs the films revert to his ownership. Subsequent showings and releases abroad are money in the bank.

By the end of the season he will own 11 telefilms outright.  
"We've begun releasing the series in France, Germany, England, Japan and Australia," he said. "But unfortunately I can't abuse the sponsor in England as I do here. The government won't allow it."

"Instead I must be satisfied with caustic introductions. But it's not the same thing at all, really. My heart isn't in it."  
Many top screen directors have undertaken individual TV shows; in every case they produced king-sized eggs. Only Hitchcock has pressed to the top.

His own show, "Alfred Hitchcock Presents," is a CBS regular. The new one, with Dennis O'Keefe narrating, is an NBC entry. In addition to juggling the TV efforts, the pink-checked Englishman is directing Kim Novak and Jimmy Stewart in "From Amongst the Dead."

"Directing movies and TV takes two totally different types of thinking," he expounded. "A small screen needs no production finesse in things such as setting, lighting and costumes. On a 60-by-40 foot movie screen every detail must be perfect. Therefore, in a TV production I spend my money on players and story."
