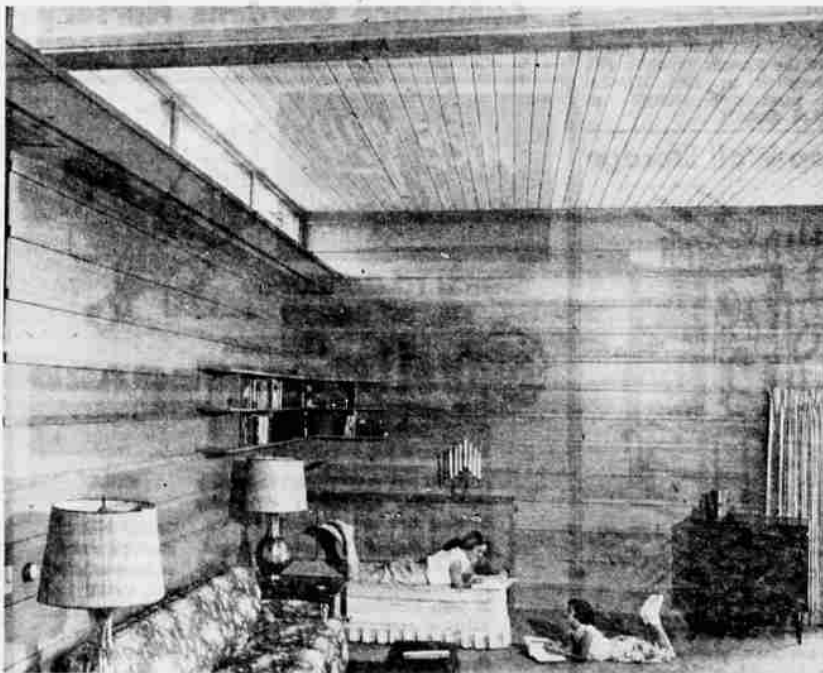
## Walls Offer Chance For Design Variety

"I want my home to be different, but not freakish." Most women would agree with this longing, and a surprisingly large number have some mighty exciting ideas for designing a home that is different. Walls offer the widest range of possibilities for variety in design and for charming originality. Walls dominate the enclosed area of a home, forming the permanent background for your entire decor. Some of the most strikingly original home designs revolve around the indoor-outdoor theme. Bringing the outdoors right into your living room has become a national pastime. It isn't done with mirrors, nor with trick lighting. In many cases it is achieved by using the exterior siding style of the home for the living room wall paneling, and having liberal expanses of glass walls to accentuate the illusion of one living area. One of the most novel and unusual living rooms features horizontal boards and battens of well textured Douglas fir. The living room walls are identical with the exterior siding, even to the soft-toned sandstone stain which gives

a warmth to the room, but does not hide the lovely grain and texture of this wood. The boards are a full 12 inches wide and the battens have been purposely kept narrow, only two inches wide, in order to avoid a heaviness in the wall. Such a wall is breath-taking in its beauty and remarkable uniqueness. It is the perfect foil for virtually any decorative scheme the housewife may desire. Its bland, neutral tones will compliment soft pastel shades, as well as the brightest color in fabric, draperies or rugs. The beauty of this indoor-outdoor wall is only one of its many assets. Another reason for its popularity is its easy maintenance, for a feather duster will keep the battens free of dust and they need to be gone over only every few months. Vertical boards and battens will work just as well for an interior wall, and some of the most friendly living rooms have one or more walls in the drop siding pattern of the home's exterior. To maintain the oneness of indoors and outdoors, it is well to try to have one common wall of



the living room and outside which meet through a glass wall. In this way you can tie the two living areas together. It is much easier to develop an air of informality in rooms where siding or boards-and-battens are used for the walls because the texture of the wood, the shadow lines and the pattern of the siding gives a healthy outdoor feeling. There is a character and distinctive personality about such backdrops for living space which add greatly to the embracing warmth of these rooms.



**WARMTH IN YOUR WALLS.** More and more housewives are asking architects to use wood liberally inside the home. This exquisite living room features 12-inch-wide Douglas fir panel boards with battens identical to exterior siding of home. Narrower ceiling boards contrast with wide panels. Soft sandstone stain creates friendly atmosphere and highlights the wonderful texture and grain of this wood.
