## Archers To Have Indoor Range For Use In Winter

Arrangements for an indoor winter range were made at last week's meeting of Klamath Archers, Inc., according to Jack Moore, president.

The group will use a building adjacent to Dale and Audrey Baxter's Farmers Lumber Company at 7151 South Sixth Street. The building, owned by the Baxters, will accommodate shooting up to 35 yards and it is planned to have the indoor range available to members seven nights each week from 7 to 10 p.m. After November 1, there will be afternoon shooting hours starting at 2 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. The range is also open to the public.

Target fees have been reduced for the winter season and will be \$5 for each adult shooter instead of the \$7.50 fee charged last year, Moore said. A target fee of \$2 per season for high school students and younger has been set. This schedule is for members of Klamath Archers. Non-members will be charged target fees for single evening.

Members of Klamath Archers are offered a special \$10 family target fee this year which represents a saving when there are two adults and at least one junior shooter in the family. Starting in November, the Klamath Archers will participate in the annual OBH mall tournament and the group is planning competition with various other archery clubs of the area during the winter.
