

Many Celebrities Appear On TV Show For Ailing Lad

LAKEVILLE, Mass. (P)—Up until yesterday, little Francis X. pathetically ill with muscular dystrophy, had never had a visitor at the Lakeville State Sanatorium. His mother is dead and his father is in prison for killing her. The youngster, also known as Little Boy Blue, thought nobody wanted him. Facing a lonely birthday, he told Dr. Kurt Jellinek last week he didn't want much, maybe four or five cards. The story of the lonely youngster got out—and it touched the heart of the nation. On his ninth birthday yesterday he learned how many friends he really has. Comedian Jerry Lewis dedicated a million-dollar television show exclusively to the ailing youngster. More than 150,000 cards and letters were mailed to him—and they were still coming today. An estimated \$10,000 was mailed to him. Offers of help jammed the hospital switchboard.

The youngster shared his birthday and the presents with an estimated 75 other hospitalized children, some of them wearing casts from the neck down. Little Francis, whose name was withheld by the hospital, requested that many of his gifts be distributed to the other children. The money he received will be placed in a trust fund for him. More important than anything else to the boy was the comment of Dr. Jellinek that "this has done wonders for the boy. A week ago he wouldn't respond and now he has a will to live."

NEW YORK (P)—Comedian Jack Benny climbed just one rung on the \$64,000 Question Financial ladder last night and decided it was a dizzying height. He quit—and left the show just \$64 richer. Benny, whose closeness with a dollar is one of his theatrical trademarks, insisted on stopping with \$64 even though quizmaster Hal March told him such a thing had never been done before. Traveling expenses alone for Benny to come from California had cost \$300, March said. But the dry-witted comedian insisted. And since the show was not prepared with a check, March and other members of the cast dug up \$64 from their own wallets. Benny won the money on the one and only question in his category, the violin. He gave the first name of the violin maker Stradivari (Antonio) and his birthplace (Cremona, Italy).

This looked like one of the mightiest atomic blasts the British have set off.
