PIQUANT ONIONS

Interesting vegetable dishes turn simple meals into something special. For instance, cooking small white onions in a spicy cheese sauce with golden pineapple chunks added will give them a taste lift and you a treat. An unusual cooking ingredient for onions in the pineapple, yet the fruit gives a delightful flavor.

PIQUANT ONIONS
25 small white boiling onions or 2 cans (No. 303)
1/2 cup liquid from cooking onions
2 cups grated Cheddar cheese
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
Salt and pepper to taste
1 can (No. 2) pineapple chunks, drained
Pour boiling water over unpeeled onions and allow to stand 2 or 3 minutes, then drain. The skins will slip right off. Cook in boiling salted water until tender. Drain, reserving 1/2 cup of the liquid. To this liquid add cheese and seasonings and stir until cheese is melted and blended. Add onions and drained pineapple chunks, cook over low heat long enough to heat through. Serve over buttered toast points. Serves 6.

BAVARIAN CREAM

1/4 cup lemon juice
1/2 cup whipping cream
6 lady fingers
Maraschino cherries
Mint sprigs
Drain peaches, reserving syrup. Crush 1 1/2 cups peaches and combine with 1/2 cup syrup, sugar and salt. Heat. Soften gelatin in lemon juice and dissolve in hot peach mixture. Cool until slightly thickened. Fold in whipped cream. Split lady fingers, and line sides of buttered 1-quart mold with them. Spoon peach-cream mixture into mold, and chill until firm. Unmold, and garnish with remaining peach slices, cherries and mint sprigs.
Makes 5 to 6 servings.

Make-Up And Jewelry Join Forces To Make You Dazzle

Not since Marco Polo ripped rubies, emeralds, diamonds and pearls from the seams of his clothes have gems — precious and otherwise — been such an important part of the costume.

Because of the dominance of this fall's massive Florentine settings and because the splendor of gems echoes the coming of a queen, jewelry can usually call the make-up cues, says Max Factor Jr.

This is particularly true according to the Hollywood expert, of new bib necklaces set with stones as multi-colored as the Aurora B's and of gem-studded chains, long enough to throw out as a lariat.

The only make-up accessory that can rise above this splendor, Factor says, is a lipstick color in such a clear, clear red that it becomes one of the great primary shades, and every jewel, including Queen Elizabeth's famous large drop earrings, has to bow to its brilliance.

This means, according to Factor, that no matter what colors the stones are in your jewelry, a clear, clear red lipstick can take them on.

But that's not so of eye make-up, says Factor. It does well, he thinks, to take its cues from as simple jewelry colors. Take blue eyeshadow. "What better company could it be with than a huge cabochon-cut sapphire or turquoise?" he asks. "Or with a necklace of lapis beads, mixed in with your multiple-strands of pearls."

Citing another example — green eyeshadow — Factor says it looks like liquid emeralds or jade, so therefore its affinity with these jewels couldn't be closer.

Next, there's brown eyeshadow, waiting to be worn with the new season's brown or copper-toned jewelry. These are the pearls that look as though they were dipped in bronze. These are the earrings as coppery as kettles, and almost as large; and topaz bracelets and beads as luminous as the eyes of your favorite cat. For such dazzlers, able to make a maharajah sigh, there is no better choice of an eyeshadow than brown.

But with any marriage of eye make-up to jewels, wear black or brownish-black creme mascara at the ceremony, urges Factor, to make your dressed-up lashes worthy of the Tiffany look of their mates.

And even if you never wore cheek rouge before, wear it now but wear it delicately, with pearls. It will do more to enhance the flash and intensity of a simple strand of poppits than a white satin display box will for Imperial pearls.

PEANUT BRITTLE COOKIES

Cream 1/2 cup butter or margarine and 1/2 cup brown sugar. Beat 1 egg and add 2 tablespoons of the beaten egg and 1 teaspoon vanilla to the butter-sugar mixture and beat well. Sift 1 cup flour, 1/4 teaspoon soda, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon together and add to creamed mixture. Finely chop 1/2 cup salted peanuts and add, mixing thoroughly. Spread dough into a 10x14-inch rectangle on an oiled cookie sheet. Brush with remaining egg and sprinkle with 1/2 cup salted peanuts. Bake at 325 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes. Break into irregular pieces like peanut brittle while still warm.

A quick salad may be made with sliced tomatoes, sprinkled with hard-cooked egg and minced chives.
