

# Television Networks Plan Big Evening For Viewers

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (UP)—This Sunday evening, NBC and CBS will squeeze three spectaculars inside your TV machine, a feat roughly comparable to stuffing a cantaloupe inside a tea bag.

CBS will offer a spec devoted to an auto firm, NBC will offer specs devoted to an oil firm and a puppet. There'll be a tubful of big stars sliding around the channels—Tyronne Power, Bing Crosby, Frank Sinatra, Jimmy Durante, just to tick off a few.

The biggest star, however, will

be Walter Slezak, who scales in at 260 pounds. Slezak will play Papa Geppetto to Mickey Rooney's Pinocchio in an NBC musical devoted to the dummy with nose trouble.

"Pinocchio" is going on at 6:30 e.d.t. just in time to ruin everybody's dinner," said Slezak during a rehearsal break. He looked melancholy. "I really can't judge very well myself, but I don't think we're going to kill off the memory of Walt Disney's 'Pinocchio'."

"But it's pretty faithful as Pinocchio goes. The only character missing is Jiminy Cricket. They had to take him out because they couldn't find an actor small enough to sit on Mickey Rooney's shoulder."

Slezak heaved a mournful sigh and watched the actors stomping around the rehearsal hall. "I like fairy tales myself," he said, "I make them up for my own children. But I think the only way to put a fairy tale on TV is to kid it a little—that way you get grown-ups to watch, too. You take 'Peter Pan'—a delightful example of nightfall.

# Fires Plague Sydney Area

SYDNEY, Australia (AP)—Fanned by gale winds, hundreds of bush fires menaced Sydney suburbs today. Hard-pressed firemen brought most under control by nightfall.

Sydney's fire chief called it "the worst day of fires in the city's history."

A 4-year-old girl was burned to death in a house in Redfern suburb, and 12 homes were destroyed in another area. Two homes burned in nearby Waterfall before volunteers put out the blazes ringing the town.

A state of emergency was declared through the state of New South Wales.

At one point Sydney—Australia's largest city—had no firemen left to answer calls. All were fighting outbreaks.

A train carrying 30,000 gallons of gasoline ran a fiery gauntlet to reach nearby Lithgow with two cars blazing. Most suburban train routes were blocked.

# Final Plans For Merrill Potato Festival Revealed

MERRILL—Committees of the 21st Klamath Basin Potato Festival to be held at Merrill, Friday and Saturday, October 18-19, have announced that final plans for the big two-day event are completed.

An invitation to all potato growers to enter exhibits in the statewide competition for cash and trophy prizes on commercial and trophy entries is extended by the committee. Entries are also invited in other agricultural divisions, the parade, community booths, or fraternal displays. Generous cash prizes, cups and ribbons are offered by the committee.

The first day of the festival will be taken up with judging of exhibits in the Merrill High

school gymnasium. Exhibits will be open to the public from 1 p.m. to midnight.

Sacred Heart Academy Trojans will meet the Bonanza Antlers on the Merrill football field at 2:30 p.m. on the opening day in the first of the two traditional festival football games. The annual banquet and crowning ceremony for the 1957 potato queen and her court is scheduled for the grade school gymnasium at 7 p.m. Nelson Reed, Klamath Falls, chairman of the Oregon Klamath River Commission will be the guest speaker.

Saturday's festivities will open with the annual parade at 11 a.m., followed by the big free barbecue at the community hall at noon. The Chiloquin Panthers will meet the Merrill Huskies at 2:30 p.m. The harvest ball is planned for the community hall beginning at 10 p.m. Saturday when the new monarch and her court will be present. The public is invited to attend the annual dance, one of the largest of the year. Agricultural exhibits will be open all day and there will be a continuous carnival Thursday, Friday and Saturday on Front Street.

State championship competition is open in the following classes: No. 1-A, not washed, 50-pound exhibit—first, \$20 and cup; second, \$25 and third \$15. White Rose Commercial, U.S. No. 1-A, 50-pound exhibit, not washed—first, \$30 and cup; second, \$15 and third, \$10.

Certified Nettle Gems, 50-pound exhibit, not washed—first, \$50 and cup; second \$25 and third, \$15. Certified White Rose, 50-pound exhibit, not washed—first, \$30 and cup; second \$15 and third, \$10.

Least number of U.S. No. 1 Nettle Gems to weigh 100 pounds or over, \$10; U.S. No. 1 bakers, all classifications—first, \$10 and second \$5. Largest single potato, U.S. No. 1—first \$5. Freakiest potato, any variety—first, \$5.

Four-H Club potato growers only, entries to consist of 25 pounds of potatoes, commercial Nettle Gems, U.S. No. 1—first, \$25; second, \$15; third, \$10 and fourth, \$5.

F.P. potato growers only, Commercial Nettle Gems, U.S. No. 1, 25-pound exhibit—first, \$10; second, \$5; third, \$3 and fourth, \$2.

High School exhibit, potatoes from any source, Commercial Nettle Gems, U.S. No. 1, 25-pound exhibit—first, \$10 to the exhibitor; second, \$5.

Entries accepted Thursday evening until 9 o'clock and Friday morning until 10 o'clock.

There will be a first prize of \$20 and a second prize of \$10 for community or fraternal displays. Exhibitors must use labels and tags furnished by headquarters. Ribbons representing prizes will be placed on all winning lots and classes. Prize money will be mailed as quickly as possible to all winners with accompanying ribbons.
