**Movie Star Marlon Brando Marries Indian Actress**

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—An exotic Indian actress honeymooned today with Marlon Brando after an East-West wedding that almost followed the script of the actor's latest movie.

Anna Kashfi, a 23-year-old beauty, thus became the envy of much of the world's feminine population as she snared Hollywood's most eligible and sought-after bachelor. It also was the first marriage for the actress, whose home is in Darjeeling, India.

Brando, 33, first met his bride when she came over here in 1953 to portray a Korean schoolteacher in the movie "Battle Hymn." The two dated occasionally but became serious only within the last six months.

The secretive Brando caught Hollywood way off guard with the simple marriage ceremony, performed at the home of his aunt in suburban Eagle Rock late yesterday afternoon.

At first, he didn't even want to announce the wedding, maintaining that his private life "is strictly my own," but then he relented to give the story to a friend or two among the press.

Only immediate relatives, including Marlon Brando Sr., were present at the brief ceremony, performed by the Rev. Walter J. Fiscus, pastor of the non-denominational Little Brown Church of San Fernando Valley.

Miss Kashfi was garbed in the traditional wedding dress of her native land, a pale green sari with a gold fringed white brocade blouse. Her shoes were red, made in the traditional Indian style.

**Basin Employment Outlook Compared With Other Areas**  
 Klamath Falls, La Grande, The Dalles and Eugene appear to be the only Oregon areas which will not suffer unusually heavy unemployment during the months of late fall and winter, according to J. D. (Rosie) McDonald, president of the Oregon Central Labor Council (AFL-CIO).

McDonald was in Klamath Falls Thursday and Friday and reported that his travels throughout the state during recent weeks indicate that an exceptionally tough employment winter will be experienced in points such as Astoria, Coos Bay, Astoria, and Portland. He had no pertinent information relative to just what the condition is expected to be in the immediate Medford area.

McDonald explained that the building trade workers in the La Grande area should have work throughout the year due to construction of a new dormitory at Eastern Oregon College, remodeling of another dorm, highway work, the construction of a 40-unit motel, and small home projects.

Crews in The Dalles area are expected to have work in the form of the Harvey Aluminum plant construction, and the building of county projects which are underway.

The labor chief added that there are also a sufficient number of projects in the Eugene and Klamath Falls regions to keep crews reasonably busy during the normal unemployment month.

"But I . . . added McDonald, "the way I see it this slight recession we're having in Oregon might in the long run do us quite a bit of good. It will perhaps bring the people of the state to realize that Oregon needs a more diversified economy."

He pointed out that today an exceptionally large share of the state's economy is based on the lumber industry. "There are quite a few persons out of work right now because of the ailing lumber market," he emphasized. "and if we had a widely diversified economy at this time it's probable that manufacturing plants of another form could absorb the workers who are normally engaged in the lumbering industry."

Concerning whether or not the tax structure of Oregon is responsible for the present economic condition of some areas of the state, McDonald said it is his belief that the tax structure has little if anything to do with it. "Sure," he added, "we could probably make a few minor modifications in our tax structure, but basically it's a sound one. The thing that's hurting us today is the tight money policy of the federal government."

"As long as the money policy is such that it is the number of houses being built are going to be restricted, and as long as building is being restricted there isn't going to be a normal and an adequate demand for timber products."
