### Liver Sausage Meat Loaf

9" square or round baking  
dish

- 1 pound liver sausage  
(braunschweiger)
- 1 cup quick cooking rolled  
oats, uncooked
- 2 eggs
- 1½ cups evaporated milk  
(1 tall can)

Preheated 350 degree  
oven 40-45 minutes

#### TOPPING

- ½ cup chili sauce
- ¼ cup butter (½ stick),  
softened
- 1 cup quick cooking rolled  
oats, uncooked
- 1 cup shredded sharp  
Cheddar cheese

Break sausage into large mixing bowl. Add first cup oats, eggs and evaporated milk. Beat until thoroughly mixed and smooth. Pour into buttered 9" baking dish. Spread chili sauce over the meat mixture. Mix butter with second cup of oats and sprinkle around the edge. Arrange shredded cheese on top of cereal. Bake in a preheated 350 degree oven for 40-45 minutes. Allow to set 5-10 minutes before cutting. Serves 6 to 8.

## Texas Salutes the Rose

TO MOST PEOPLE, Texas means cattle ranches and oil wells, but the Lone Star State also has a good corner on the nation's rose industry.

To prove it, the city of Tyler annually stages the Texas Rose Festival, the Southwest's foremost floral pageant. Tyler itself, easily the largest rose-growing area in the United States, claims the title of Rose Capital of the World.

The festival is held each Autumn (Oct. 18-20 this year) when Tyler's Municipal Rose Garden is in full bloom. Highlights include a Rose Parade, a Rose Show, and of course, the crowning of a Rose Queen. This year's royal lady: winsome Miss Kay Howard of Tyler.
