

Brennan Praises Irish Team; But Warns Of Days To Come

CHICAGO (UP)—Terry Brennan sizes up his Notre Dame football team as "good but not great" and with the worst yet to come.

The youthful coach reminded his followers that a rough road lies ahead on the schedule and he cautioned Irish backers not to get any notions of an immediate return to the oldtime football glory.

"We're in a happy position now and our team is much better than last year," he said. "But by no means does it indicate Notre Dame is back."

Brennan made his first appearance as a victorious coach in almost two years before a Chicago Quarterback Club lunch Monday.

"And it feels good, let me tell you," he said. "I always felt we'd get going. I'm thankful that the Supreme Court didn't repeal the law of averages."

Although Brennan warned of the rough competition ahead, he still basked in the glow of last Saturday's 23-21 triumph over Army when Monty Stickles' field goal won the game.

"Just think, if that kick was off the mark, I could be a bum instead of a hero," Brennan joked.

He said he was happy with the team's performance from the season's start, when the Irish beat Indiana and then Purdue.

"The team is in the best shape it's ever been and it's a fighting club that refuses to quit," he said.

"The Army win was a real shot in the arm that should keep the boys' morale up for the remaining games."

"I saw a lot of praise for Nick Pietrosante and Dick Lynch and, of course, Stickles. But a lot of credit goes to those guys up in front like Al Eucyur, Bob Scholtz, and Jim Schaaf. They played a whole of a game in the line."

Brennan discussed his decision to have Stickles make the try for the now celebrated place-kick in the fourth period instead of Don White who normally handles such chores.

"Stickles missed a try for the extra point earlier but he also booted two kickoffs into the end zone. I felt he was kicking well against Army, so I let him make the kick in what turned out to be a wise decision."

The Irish coach was asked which game he will now point for. "Pittsburgh, our next foe, and then Navy," he replied, and added with a slight grimace, "The Michigan game, Oklahoma and Iowa."

Detroit Tigers All Set For Trading Talk

DETROIT (UP)—Baseball is completed for the year but the trade talking season is just in its "warming up" period, Detroit Tiger General Manager Johnny McHale said today.

McHale brushed aside Chicago White Sox Vice President Charles Comiskey's talk about obtaining Harvey Kuenn or Charley Maxwell.

"He's been talking about Kuenn for a month," McHale said. "But all he wants to give up are second liners like Sammy Esposito, when Chuck starts including the names of Minnie Miros, Nellie Fox and Bill Pierce, we'll start getting down to business."

"After all, McHale laughed, it's about time they gave us Pierce back—he's been on loan a long time. The Pierce trade was probably the worst ever pulled by Detroit. The Tigers obtained catcher Aron Robinson, who did not last, for the slick southpaw."

McHale said he wouldn't trade any players who had a bad year this season just to trade them. Kuenn was among the Tigers who had poor seasons, hitting below .300 for the first time in his major league career.

"When we trade, it's going to be to help the club," McHale emphasized.

He said Detroit's chief interest is in Billy Martin of Kansas City. Al Smith of Cleveland, a first baseman to spell Ray Boone and perhaps an outfielder. The fourth-place Tigers also are weak behind the plate.

McHale said Detroit was long on pitchers and that the hurlers were the Tigers' top trade bait. The A's want southpaw Billy Hoeltz for Martin.

EUGENE, Ore. (UP)—The University of Oregon Webfoots today continued to work on their plans for next Saturday's meeting with the explosive Washington State Cougars.

Scout Jerry Frei told Webfoot coach Len Casanova Monday that it would take a "near-perfect defensive effort by Oregon to contain the Cougars next weekend."

CORVALLIS, Ore. (UP)—Oregon State mentor Tommy Prothro said Monday that wingback Earl Durden and tackle Ted Bates, the only Beavers injured in Saturday's game with stubborn Idaho, would probably be ready for the UCLA game this Saturday.

STANFORD, Calif. (UP)—The Stanford Indians worked out against Washington plays Monday particularly on passing, as the Tribe received the first promising news from club doctors in weeks.

Team physicians said fullback Chuck Shea, and Gary Van Galder and fullback Lou Valli, all out with various injuries, should be ready to go against Washington this weekend. Three players were out with influenza, they said, but should be ready by Saturday.

These were guard Don Manoukian, halfback Al Harrington and end Jim Ukropina.

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UP)—Nine members of San Jose State's first and second teams were sidelined by flu Monday as the illness-injury list grew to 17 players out of a total of 47.

Coach Bob Titchener said he hoped the squad would be back to full strength in time for Saturday's game with San Diego State, but he had his fingers crossed.

STOCKTON, Calif. (UP)—Coach Jack (Moose) Myers of the College of Pacific said Monday that he considered next Saturday's game with the Idaho Vandals to be the Tigers' "toughest" to date.

"They're better than they've been in the last 10 years," Myers said, as he began preparing his squad for the tilt.

LOS ANGELES (UP)—The Southern California Trojans practiced at almost full strength today for their game with California Saturday at Berkeley.

Coach Don Clark had his fingers crossed as he sent his squad through a dummy scrimmage and 20 minutes of contact work Monday in preparation for the coming game.

The Trojans were healthy with the exception of fullback Ed Isherwood who was out with a cold or flu. He was expected to be well in time to meet the Bears.

LOS ANGELES (UP)—Coach Henry (Red) Sanders sent his UCLA Bruin squad through offensive drills today in preparation for the game with powerful Oregon State Saturday at the Memorial Coliseum.

"They know our system and we know theirs," said Sanders in explanation of why the Bruins would not concentrate on defense so much this week.

Sanders said Monday that Oregon State, last year's PCC Rose Bowl representative, probably was even better this year.

DIES IN CRASH—British driver Ronald Seales was killed Monday night when his Cooper racing car swerved off the Monza track and burst into flames. The accident occurred while Seales was attempting to set a new 24-hour world record on the famed Monza course.

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Today's Sports Parade

NEW YORK (UP)—Football, whether you talk about the college or pro game, has moved into a new cycle of play today in which the keynote is defense and ball control.

Gone, on the whole, are the tremendous scores of the past few years. Gone, too, to a great extent is the wide open passing game which marked the height of the T-formation craze.

All of which means that the defense finally has caught up to the offense.

"That's the way the game goes," explains Bud Donelli, the Columbia coach. "When the T grabbed hold, it took a while for everybody to learn to use it—and it took a while for a new era until somebody comes up with something new. Then the game will break wide open again."

Professional scoring, which was reaching stratospheric proportions at one stage, is indicative of the change.

Last year, the Chicago Bears led the National Professional League with 363 points, which was an average of 30 per game. This year they are averaging 14.3 points per game. The New York Giants, who were the league champions, led the Eastern Conference with 264 points last year. That's a 22-point per game average. This season they're averaging 17 points for three games.

Baltimore came up with part of the answer to such scoring when it devised a four-man defensive line composed entirely of tackles. These are Gino Marchetti, 240 pounds; Art Donovan, 265; "Big Daddy" Lipscomb, 285, and Don Joyce, 250 pounds. Even a veteran pro line finds it extremely difficult, if not impossible, to stop this kind of tonnage when it crashes in to flatten the ball carrier or pursue the passer.

LSU threw only seven passes in upsetting Georgia Tech. Duke used only eight passes in stopping Rice; Oklahoma passed for only 24 yards in dropping Texas; South Carolina threw only three in whipping Furman and Auburn tossed only seven to balance the attack in beating Kentucky.

The loser always could be counted on to throw and throw. But Nebraska only pitched five in being badly beaten by Pitt and William & Mary passed only eight times in being flattened by Penn State.
