

Talented Vocalist From KF To Sing In Opera Program

A talented young Klamath Falls vocalist, Gail Nerseht, sophomore at Stephens College, has been named to the only student lead to sing in the tragic opera, "Lucia Di Lammermoor," Donizetti. It will be sung tonight at the college. This is one of two operas produced each year by the opera workshop at Stephens in which students support professional singers.

Rolls for students are assigned on a competitive basis to those enrolled in the opera workshop where they receive training in stage movement and character

portrayal, learning complete rolls. Lucia is to be sung by Marjorie Gordon, leading soprano at New York's City Center, whose achievements include recitals, opera, musical comedy and her own radio show. Gail, who also sings soprano, will sing the role of Alice, companion to Lucia. Edgardo will be Jim Hawthorne, whose tenor voice and dramatic style is known to audiences and critics. He has appeared with many of the nation's opera companies and scored successes in several Broadway musicals, including 16 months as a

member of the original cast of "South Pacific."

Other roles are popularly cast. Raimondo and Lord Bucklaw will be sung by Val Patacchi, head of the music department at Stephens.
