Recreation Report Given

DUNSMUIR—A list of accomplishments and expenditures for the current year was issued today by the Dunsmuir Recreation Commission. The Dunsmuir Recreation District's boundaries coincide with the Dunsmuir Elementary School District and recreational activities are supported by a special tax rate. To date this year, the commission has installed a new septic tank at the swimming pool, a new diving tower, painted the pool and built sidewalks on two sides of the fence. Life guards and supervision were among the pool expenses. As part of a five-year improvement program, \$1,000 was spent on the city park picnic and playgrounds. The ball park was maintained by the commission for daytime and evening activities. Expenditures for the 1956-57 fiscal year included: \$6,259.13 for wages, \$2,236.90 for materials and supplies, \$1,712.24 for utilities, \$81.92 for telephone, telegraph and transportation, \$312.34 for insurance and \$6,940.96 for capital outlay. This final figure includes a new septic tank, rest rooms, a concession booth and dugouts at the ball park as well as the final payment of \$3,286.32 on the ball park lights. The present ball park lighting system is inadequate for night baseball, and provision for this improvement has been budgeted for next year. Mrs. Thelma Bender, commission secretary, said.
