## Release Of Arkansas Guard From Federal Duty Starts

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — The release of 8,700 Arkansas National Guardsmen from federal duty got into full swing today as the Little Rock integration crisis continued in a state of suspended animation.

Rep. Brooks Hays (D-Ark.), an unsuccessful peacemaker so far in the state-federal struggle, said at Washington that the situation here "is being rapidly stabilized."

The Army in effect said the same thing last week when it pulled out half the 1,100 paratroopers from Little Rock and ordered the release of the guardsmen.

Yesterday the guardsmen began going off active duty. The Army estimated it might take 10 days before all 8,700 were released.

Gov. Orval Faubus had no immediate comment. He commented that "we're still occupied."

At previously all-white Central High School, the remaining 1,800 guardsmen and 550 paratroopers are protecting nine Negro students.

The three boys and six girls now are in their fifth week of integrated classes in the 2,000-pupil school. Two were ill with influenza yesterday.

## Actor Raps Dope Charge

LOS ANGELES — Actor Scott Brady, 33, and publicist Desmond Slattery, 43, charged with possessing marijuana, have accused the arresting officers of "bizarre and unusual conduct."

When they appeared for arraignment yesterday, their attorney Robert Eaton told Municipal Judge Louis W. Kaufman: "Our investigation will show the bizarre and unusual conduct of these officers in entering Mr. Brady's home, ransacking it and searching it, then leaving without an arrest, only to return the next day and arrest them."

Eaton said there is a possibility of false arrest proceedings. Preliminary hearing for Brady and Slattery was set for Nov. 19.

## Sinatra Buys Jolson Estate

PALM SPRINGS, Calif. — Frank Sinatra has bought a Palm Springs estate once owned by the late Al Jolson.

The crooner is reported to have paid about \$90,000 to Donald Duncan, who is in the parking meter business.

The walled, three-acre estate has a three-bedroom home and a two-bedroom poolside cottage. Sinatra is selling his smaller Tamarrisk Country Club home.
