The subject matter of the paintings ranges from the coast and mountain peaks to the deep forests of the Oregon country and the changes of mood of the artist are reflected in the paintings. It is hoped that a great number of people will take the opportunity to see these paintings not only from the historical significance of the artist but from the sheer charm of the paintings themselves.

The Klamath Art Center in the Mountain View Housing Project will be open for this exhibit on Friday, October 25, from 7 to 10 p.m., Saturday, October 26, from 1 to 5 p.m. and Sunday, October 27, from 2 until 9 p.m. Coffee will be served on Sunday afternoon.

**REPARATIONS OFFER**  
TOKYO (UP)—Japan has decided to propose an 800-million dollar plan to settle the long-standing World War II reparations issue with Indonesia. It was reported here today. A cabinet meeting late Monday decided to offer 200-million in "pure" reparations, 200-million in long-term loans and 400-million in the form of technical cooperation schemes, the reports said. Indonesian authorities have said there was no possibility of a change in their demand for 400-million dollars in "pure" reparations.
