Doleza and Elmer Kortmeyer are co-sponsors of the class which will present the program and banquet in the spring.

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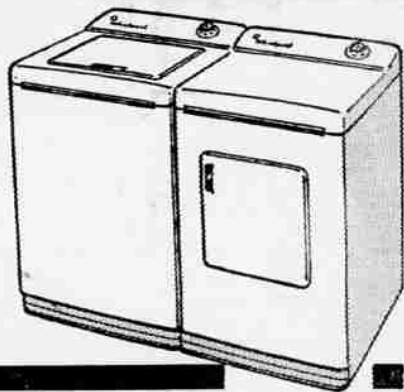
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
