### Tests Conducted For Scholarships

This is the third annual test for scholarship rating by the business sponsored Meritt Scholarship group. Students in high schools all over the United States will take the standard tests and awards from \$100 to \$2,200 will be made to the winners.

About 166,000 seniors participated in the program last year, representing 12,500 schools. Seven thousand five hundred semifinalists were selected from 3,200 schools.

Merit Scholarships were awarded to 836 seniors, making this the largest independent scholarship program in the history of American education.

Some 57 business corporations and foundations took part in the 1956-57 scholarship program.

### Pilot Steers Burning Plane Away From Residential Area

MIDWEST CITY, Okla. (AP)—An Air Force Flying Boxcar heading for home exploded and burned last night near a residential area that one eyewitness said the pilot apparently maneuvered to miss.

The four crewmen on the C119 transport were killed.

The big plane hit in a wooded area of Blackjack Oak. Most of the wreckage landed in a dry creek bed.

Charles Chilcoat, 31, an Air Force veteran and technician at Linker Air Force Base saw the crash.

"He turned on his landing lights so he could locate a clear spot," Chilcoat said of the pilot.

"My God, that was the extreme sacrifice!"

The plane had just taken off from Tinker for its home base of Chanute, Ill., after a stopover on a flight from Los Angeles.

Names of the crew were withheld by the Air Force.

Several persons heard the plane in trouble before the terrific explosion.

"If the plane had fallen 500 yards to the east, west, or south, it would have been in the middle of houses," an ambulance driver at the crash scene said.

"I think he rode it out to clear those houses," said Chilcoat who was outside his home, near the crash site, working on his car.

He said the pilot evidently was going into a glide when it appeared the "left engine blew up and the plane disintegrated."

Midwest City sprang from farm lands in World War II to house workers at Tinger and Douglas Aircraft Co.'s plant. Thousands of the big air material area base civilian and military personnel live here on the edge of Oklahoma City.
