COUNTY WOMEN CARED AND SHARED DURING UNITED FUND CAMPAIGN

"The hand that rocks the cradle is the hand that rules the world."

That's what William Ross Wallace, Kentucky poet and lawyer, said 92 years ago. Sixty years earlier the first women's club for charity had been organized — the Female Charitable Society of Wiscasset, Maine, founded November 18, 1895. From that time, the truism expressed by Wallace has become more obvious as women rapidly realized that by working together they could achieve magnanimous deeds.

With another historical date approaching—Thanksgiving—we publicly recognize the many women in Klamath County who answered their community's call to service during the United Fund's 1958 "Operation Fair Share." The subjects pictured are only a few of the army of women who marched to meet the needs of the American Red Cross and the 26 youth, health and welfare agencies of United Fund. For them UF was another duty in their busy life as wife, mother and citizen.
