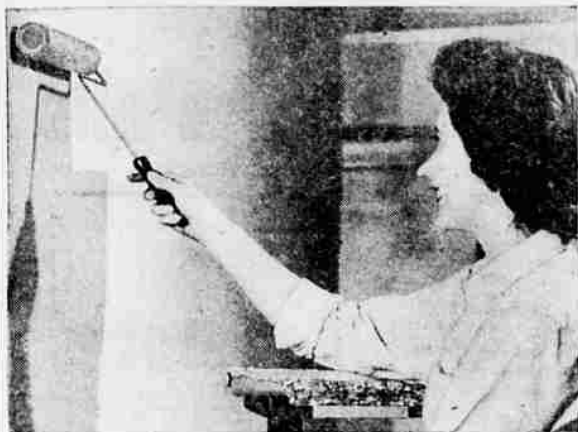
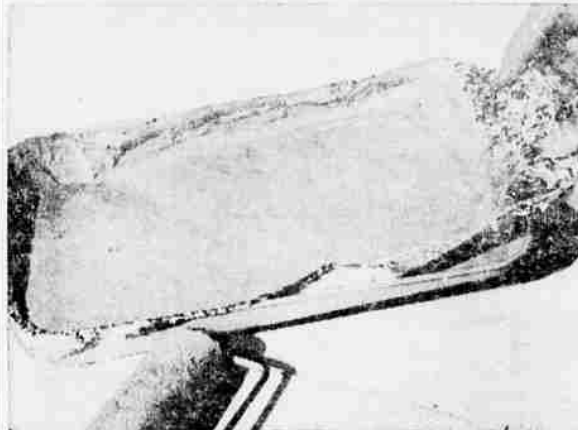




ROLLERS covered with a new synthetic fabric are suitable for use with most paints. Consult your dealer for the proper covering with which to handle specialized paints.

Using Rollers Neatest Trick Since Tom Sawyer's Con Job

If you're not acquainted with Tom Sawyer's fence-painting technique you've missed the best gimmick ever invented for reluctant do-it-yourselfers.

A quick trip to the library for a copy of Mark Twain's classic is recommended.

Pending the time that you can make his system workable indoors, perhaps the least painful approach to the chore of painting a room lies in the use of the paint roller.

Your first task is to pick the proper type of roller for the paint you plan to use and the surface on which you'll work.

For many painting purposes, a roller covered with a synthetic, wool-like fiber is usually suitable. It works well with use of any oil or alkyd-based paint that is to be applied to a relatively smooth surface.

For rubber-based paints, enamels and varnishes, use a roller with a mohair cover, or other fabric with a very short nap.

To produce special effects, there are rollers with built-in designs available. Background color is first rolled on with a conventional roller, transferring its paint to the embossing as you roll on the design.

Still other rollers can be purchased which produce stippled, stucco-like effects.

Steer clear of fast-drying lacquers or quick-drying enamel when roller painting. Results are much more satisfactory when the paints formulated for roller application are used.

You can use an old cake pan for a paint tray, but the money saved isn't worth the grief you inevitably purchase. A paint tray with sloping bottom is inexpensive and lasts indefinitely.

A real worksaver to consider is the use of aluminum foil for lining the paint pan. It minimizes clean-up operations and allows you to use several colors in succession without need for owning several pans. Just carefully fold and discard foil before each paint change.

Pour small amount of paint in tray, work roller until it is evenly covered, roll up once or twice on surface of pan that's above the

point level to remove excess paint and you're all set to tackle the wall.

Roll with a light, even stroke. Roll up and down, then left and right.

When roller's paint load is exhausted, repeat loading process and start on an unpainted section of wall adjacent to your first work and roll toward and into edge of area first painted. A couple of passes, vertically, where areas join helps to minimize lap marks.

Read your labels on paint cans carefully. While most interior paints are nontoxic, it's best to work with windows open, if you can, to rid the room quickly of fumes. Many paints dry quickly and the room can be occupied within a matter of hours.

Clean up spills on carpets or woodwork as you go; don't let drips or dribbles harden.

To clean your roller, use solvent recommended for particular type of paint used, first working out excess paint by running roller over sheets of old newspapers.

If your roller has a removable cover, so much the better. It's easier to clean.

Final operation is a good washing in warm water and soap; rinse well and hang up to dry.

New Diseases Strike Cattle

Three new transmissible diseases of cattle have added their threat to the farm profit picture in recent years, making the disease situation even more confusing, according to a report recently by the American Foundation for Animal Health.

The similarity in some symptoms of these diseases, and their similarity, also, to several other cattle problems makes prompt diagnosis by a veterinarian doubly important, the foundation says. The three new diseases are infectious bovine rhinotracheitis, virus diarrhea, and mucosal disease. Clinical or pathological signs of these three may also resemble those of two older diseases, shipping fever and malignant catarrhal fever.

Fortunately, the death rate is low, with the exception of malignant catarrhal fever and mucosal disease, which are almost always fatal. All five of the diseases produce a fever of 104 degrees or higher, resulting in depression as another symptom. However, the fever may be present for several

days before the depression is noted. Other symptoms common to all five conditions include increased rate of respiration and a nasal discharge. Scouring may be caused by virus diarrhea and mucosal disease, but not by the other three.

Cattle owners should obtain a diagnosis promptly if any of these warning symptoms appear, in order to guard against undue losses, foundation authorities advise.

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Asphalt Handles Paving Problems

The Greeks had a word for it — asphaltos — meaning stable, firm, or secure; Noah had a use for it, as waterproofing for the ark; and thousands of years later, we're still finding new ways of putting petroleum asphalt to work.

Until about the turn of the century, asphalt came from natural pools in the earth. Then petroleum refiners found that the substance left after processing crude oil was asphalt. Since then, asphalt has become a product of many uses, and is manufactured according to exact specifications for each use.

Now refiners have developed a paving asphalt that seems just the thing to persuade reluctant husbands to get around to making that little paved patio in the back yard. It's the same type of paving used on highways, but thanks to a mixed-in petroleum solvent, it can be used cold, right from the 100-pound plastic-lined bags it comes in.

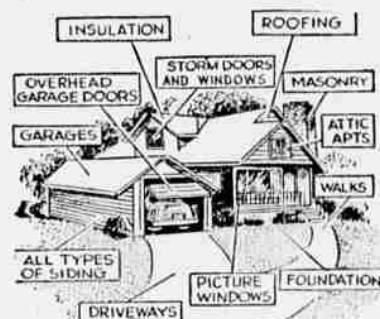
Unlike other surfacings, the asphalt can be put directly over firm ground, or even grass, without any foundation, and need be spread only one inch thick, instead of the conventional six or seven inches. Spreading is done with a rake shovel, and the job is finished by going over the surface with a lawn roller.

It's said that after one hour, the surface is hard enough to walk on, and after a few hours, even an automobile won't dent it. In fact, you can pave the patio in the morning, and throw a patio party the same evening!
