Nuclear Powered Ship To Be Built

WASHINGTON (UP)—The keel of the first nuclear-powered surface ship of the U.S. Navy will be laid Dec. 2 in Quincy, Mass., ahead of schedule.

Bethlehem Steel Corp. said the keel of the atom-powered guided missile cruiser U.S.S. Long Beach would be laid at its Quincy shipyard.

The company said preliminary work had been expedited so successfully that construction could begin considerably in advance of the original target date.

The Navy already has two atomic-powered submarines in operation. Others are under construction.
