Countermissile Well On Way By US Researchers According To Army Chief

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor said today that a countermissile against the deadly ballistic missile already has its beginning in the Army's Nike Zeus Project.

Such a defense can be provided at acceptable cost, the Army chief of staff added in an address prepared for the third annual meeting of the Assn. of U.S. Army.

"We can have an antimissile defense and indeed we must have one if we are to retain our nuclear retaliatory deterrent capability, which is indispensable to the prevention of general atomic war," Taylor said.

After referring earlier in his address to the reportedly successful launching by Russia of an intercontinental ballistic missile, Taylor said, "In the light of recent events, we are becoming increasingly impressed with the need to press forward in the development of the antimissile missile."

"The Army project in this field is, as you know, the Nike Zeus which already partially exists in the form of research and development components. All our efforts in this field have been crowned with success appropriate to the stage of the program."

"We see no reason why the country cannot have an antimissile missile defense for a price that is within reach," he continued. "I am sure many of you have heard the statement that the dollar requirements for this kind of defense are astronomical and that the whole concept is beyond consideration. I can assure you that the studies which I have seen lead me to a different conclusion."

He made no estimate of the cost, however.

The technical problem in developing an antimissile missile is to design a system which can detect an ICBM traveling at speeds of more than 10,000 m.p.h. in a trajectory several hundred miles high and then direct an intercepting missile to destroy the ICBM before it can reach the target area.

Taylor recalled Russia's crushing of the Hungarian revolutionists and her threats in the Middle East — "situations short of general

war." To those events have been added two important technological developments — the reported ICBM success and the satellite launching, Taylor said.

"It now seems likely that these missile and satellite successes will be followed by an aggressive program of diplomatic truculence on the part of the Soviets, Taylor said. "Now that they have sought to impress the world with their expanding scientific and technological muscles, it seems quite consistent that they may be even more ready to embark on or to support aggressive courses of action designed to further enhance their world position."
