The purpose, function and accomplishments of the United Nations were reviewed for members of the Klamath Falls Soroptimist Club during the recent luncheon meeting at the Winema Hotel.

The speaker was Charles Johnson, president of the Klamath Falls Chapter of the Oregon United Nations Association, also appointed by Mayor Lawrence Slater as chairman of United Nations Day.

He was introduced by Claudia Moore, program chairman.

While the world has been engaged in scientific research, the speaker said, study in the field of human relations has been lagging with resultant misunderstandings. Hope of most of the men-

ber nations is centered in the UN security council maintain an international peace. Most recent members are Japan and Gana.

### Nautilus Makes Trip Under Ice

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Secretary of the Navy Thomas S. Gates says the atomic-power submarine Nautilus has scored another first by traveling 1,000 miles under the arctic ice pack in five and a half days.

Gates, here to address Republican groups in San Jose today and Oakland tomorrow, said the Nautilus was on a cruise this month testing equipment and machinery and gathering operational and scientific data.

He noted that the Nautilus now has an operational sister ship, the Sea Wolf.

"We have approved up through the 1958 shipbuilding program 17 additional nuclear submarines,"
