

'Most Beautiful' Street In Chicago

CHICAGO (AP)—Chicago's Michigan Avenue was described last night by a nationally known authority on city planning as the nation's "most elegant" street.

Christopher Tunnard, associate professor of city planning at Yale University, said Michigan Avenue has surpassed New York's Park Avenue as the most beautiful street in the country.

Tunnard, who spoke at a meeting of the Greater North Michigan Avenue Assn., said of Michigan Avenue: "You get an impression of grandeur and beauty. It is the most elegant of American streets."

Vice Officers Watch Presley

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Elvis Presley, quiver-lipped hero of the fainting set, performed under the scrutiny of vice squad officers last night. They said they found nothing wrong with the show, from a standpoint of propriety at any rate.

The officers were dispatched to the Pan-Pacific Auditorium because of complaints about the previous night's proceedings. It was then that about 10,000 of Presley's constituents went insane over their idol's unique brand of song and dance.

Many parents who accompanied their offspring to the production claimed Presley was manipulating his hips in a manner that was most vulgar, to say the least.

REDDING, Calif. (AP)—The barking of her little dog led searchers to Sarah Ann Dobbs, a 3-year-old deaf-mute lost overnight in a chilly, wooded canyon.

The child was found yesterday snuggled up to the puppy, dozing. She was clad only in a light T-shirt and panties. She apparently had stumbled into a creek and removed her wet jeans.

Several hundred men, with bloodhounds and assisted by the Civil Air Patrol had searched the area.
