Prison Escape Attempt Fails

WALLA WALLA, Wash. (AP) — Six convicts who failed in an attempt to escape from the State Prison here Saturday by tunneling under the wall are in maximum custody quarters.

Five of the six were caught in the tunnel by prison guards who said the digging activities "sounded like a horse kicking on the barn door." The sixth was working in a construction area and had assisted the others in starting the digging, Warden Bob Rhy said.

Rhy identified the six as William Jesse James, who took part in the 1955 tunnel escape of 10 inmates; Ralph H. Lower, King County, in for forgery; James L. Renick, King County, grand larceny; Howard J. Hubbell, Pacific County, burglary; Fred J. Johnson, Walla Walla, burglary; and B. E. McDonald, Snohomish County, robbery.

The tunnel extended from an unfinished part of the Wing 8 basement to within about 12 feet of the wall. It was the same area where the 1955 escape had been made. All 10 of the escapees at that time were later captured.

Basin Chamber To Elect Five New Board Members

According to the chamber's by-laws, the board will meet during the first week in December and elect the president, vice presidents, treasurer and manager.

Low Flying Brings Arrest

EVERETT, Wash. (AP) — Max H. Schunacker, who was piloting a helicopter from Vancouver, B.C., to Pasadena, Calif., was arrested Sunday on charges he flew his whirlybird too low over traffic-jammed U.S. Highway 99.

State Patrolman Bob Landon charged Schunacker, a former Marine Corps air search and rescue officer from Long Beach, Calif., with illegal flying after, Landon said, Schunacker guided the helicopter to within 15 or 20 feet of the highway near Marysville, six miles north of here.

Landon flashed his red light at the helicopter. Landon said the craft gained altitude and then dipped to near building level over Everett as it headed south. On landing at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport 40 miles south of here, Schunacker was ordered to return to Paine Air Force Base, just south of here.

On his arrival at Paine, Schunacker was arrested by Landon and charged before a justice of the peace. Schunacker was jailed at the Snohomish County jail in lieu of \$100 pending a hearing of his case, tentatively set for Nov. 7.

Schunacker, employed by Cal-Rotors Inc., of Pasadena, was accompanied on the flight by John Lester Hall, president of the corporation.

Schunacker said he was always flying above 100 feet. He said he had been flying above the highway because the helicopter was "running a bit rough and I was afraid of possible trouble."

Area Reports High Rainfall

MOUNT SHASTA — Prediction for an early fall, and an abundance of rain appears to have been based on sound reasoning. According to Frank M. Ashell, local U.S. Weather bureau forecaster, nearly six more inches of rain have fallen since July 1 than the average for that time.

The snow pack for this time of year is far heavier than average, which is considered an indication of a good water supply during 1958.

Temperatures are well below normal for the period, with several instances of ice in the region around Mount Shasta.
