After the shot, Harry retired inside to have drops put in his eyes. Then he told about his operation for a detached retina, which appears to have been more serious than many people realized. "It all started when I was doing the Nat King Cole TV show on the coast," he related. "The bright lights seemed to cause a fuzziness in my eye. I continued playing dates," but the doctor told him, "Another couple of days with your eye in that condition and you may lose the sight of it entirely." The corrective operation re-

**NEW BORN VOLCANO**  
 HORTA, Faial Island, Azores (UP) — A new islet was rising from the surface of the sea today amidst volcanic explosions — less than a week after another volcano has gone into renewed activity and has hurled ash and molten rock high into the air. In nearly a month of earlier activity, the volcano built a new islet which last week sank into the sea and disappeared.
