DOVER, N. H. (AP)—A proposal for fluoridation of the city water supply was defeated decisively yesterday by a vote of 3,949 to 668.

Two members of the Board of Health campaigned vigorously against the plan claiming fluorides were poison, especially harmful to elderly people and that their use was advocated by Communists. It was supported by the Dover Dental Society and several parent-teacher groups.

Meyner's National Stock Soars After Election Win

NEWARK, N. J. (AP)—Democratic Gov. Robert B. Meyner's national political stock hit a new high today after his resounding reelection victory over a Republican candidate who ran with President Eisenhower's full backing.

With 4,039 of New Jersey's 4,219 districts reported in yesterday's election, Meyner led State Sen. Malcolm S. Forbes 1,054,581 to 854,609.

Meyner's plurality of 200,000 votes in a normally Republican state was sure to add to his stature as a possible Democratic presidential or vice presidential candidate in 1960. Only minutes after Forbes conceded defeat at 11:13 p. m., some GOP leaders were seeing national issues as a partial cause of Meyner's victory.

NROTC Tests Deadline Near

High school seniors and graduates between 17 and 21 have until November 16 to apply for the Navy's Reserve Officers Training Corps, Vice Adm. James A. Holloway Jr., chief of naval personnel, said today. Applicants will take the nationwide competitive examination on December 14 as the first step toward an appointment as midshipman.

Designed to supplement the officer output of the Naval Academy, the NROTC program makes it possible for a young man to earn a commission while studying at the civilian college of his choice which has an NROTC unit.

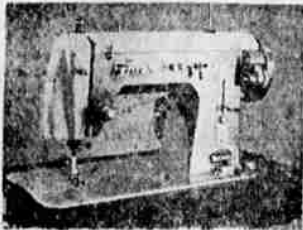
All tuition, fees and books are furnished by the Navy, and the student receives an annual retainer of \$600 for four years. During the summers the student goes on fascinating training cruises to many parts of the world. After completing the usual four years of college course, he is commissioned in the Regular Navy or Marine Corps and goes on active duty.

Forbes ran as an Eisenhower Republican. He sought to pin a high-spending tag on Meyner, charged the Democratic governor permitted a letdown in law enforcement and said Meyner was dominated by what he called "CIO bosses."

Meyner ran on his record, which he said refuted Forbes' charges. One national issue which was brought into the campaign was the integration question. Forbes said Meyner took a weak stand against segregation. Meyner reported he favored the Supreme Court's integration rulings.

In several speeches, Forbes told

Negroes it was their duty to vote Republican to back up Eisenhower's action in Little Rock, Ark. A spot check of a few Negro voting districts showed Meyner got more votes yesterday than he did in 1953.

The voter turnout was surprisingly large, totaling close to two million. Meyner was the first New Jersey gubernatorial candidate ever to get more than a million votes. His plurality was the largest in a gubernatorial race in 11 years. He carried Forbes home county 24,082 to 20,844.

The governor's victory spurred an impromptu street parade in his home town of Phillipsburg on the Delaware River. The governor

made a midnight speech in the center of town. A school holiday and parade was scheduled in Phillipsburg today.

Meyner's victory was a new high in a political career that seemed at a dead end six years ago. He was defeated for reelection as a state senator in 1951. In 1953 he accepted a Democratic nomination for governor that most

party notables didn't want and won an upset victory.

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
