### Ike, First Lady May Tour Through Europe Next Year

WASHINGTON (UP) — President and Mrs. Eisenhower hope to visit London and other European capitals next year. Sources close to the White House disclosed the first family is trying to make arrangements for the trip.

Such a tour would be in line with the President's desire to draw the United States and European nations closer together to meet the onrush of Russian science and military power.

Eisenhower will go to Paris next month to attend a "summit" conference of North Atlantic Treaty Nations to tackle ways of achieving greater Western unity.

The British have been particularly anxious to have the President come to their country. Queen Elizabeth and British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan visited the U.S. last month and met with the President.

In meeting with them, Eisenhower stressed the need for greater Anglo-American cooperation to meet Russia's challenge in the new space-missile age.

Disclosure that arrangements were underway to try to set up the European tour came after it was brought out that Eisenhower probably would not go to London following the Paris NATO meeting.

The British touched off a trans-Atlantic exchange Wednesday with an announcement that the President had been forced to defer a proposed December visit because

to France had to do with his heavy official schedule and not the condition of Mrs. Eisenhower's health.

Asked whether Mrs. Eisenhower was ill, Mrs. Wheaton replied: "No." The first lady, who underwent an operation Aug. 6, has been more active in recent days than in a long time.

Mrs. Eisenhower, unaware of the trans-Atlantic exchange, said Wednesday morning she was "feeling fine" when she appeared

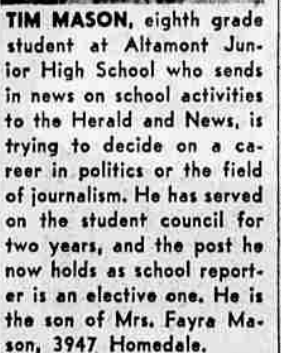
at a benefit bazaar. But she added she still "can't do too much walking." Her remarks suggested that she tires somewhat easily and is under doctor's orders to avoid strenuous exercise.

London newspapers said today Mrs. Eisenhower's health was not the reason for putting off the visit. The strongest statement was made by the Labor party's Daily Herald which said Queen Elizabeth was "hurt" by the President's decision.

### Expert Gives Flu Warning

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (UP) — A Harvard Medical School professor urged the public today not to be fooled by a leveling off or decline in Asian flu because a second and more severe wave may strike this winter.

"Don't let up on vaccination," warned Dr. David D. Rutstein, professor of preventive medicine. "And be sure to get at least two shots."

Those who are allergic to egg, which is present in all flu vaccine, should not be vaccinated, since the reaction might be fatal, he said.

Rutstein explained that the second wave of the world-wide epidemic, known to physicians as a pandemic, would be more dangerous than the first. The Asian flu virus is a hitherto unfamiliar flu strain to which the population has no immunity.

"Doctors will be looking for the complicating pneumonia (in the second wave)," Rutstein said. "I understand facilities have been and still are being set up by health departments to give better laboratory diagnosis of the secondary infecting germ."

**ZAPOTOCKY RECOVERS**  
(VIENNA UP) Communist Czech President Antonin Zapotocky has "almost completely recovered" from the heart attack he suffered last Monday, Prague Radio reported today. The broadcast heard here said the 73-year-old president's recovery is proceeding without complications. The radio reported him seriously ill Monday and that he had been taken to the state hospital for treatment.
