

Henley Edges Pel JV's 12-7 To Climax Hornet Season

The blue clad Henley Hornets exploded for two touchdowns in the first quarter to edge out the Klamath Falls Jayvees 12-7 Thursday afternoon at Modoc Field.

Early in the game the Jayvees fumbled at midfield. The Hornets recovered and drove to the Jayvees 35. Then Warren Sohrakoff took a pitchout and sailed down to the KF three. On the next play Sohrakoff bucked over for the score.

A few minutes later the Hornets were in scoring position again on runs by Sohrakoff, Ferguson, and Chapman. With the ball on the Jayvees 30, Henley scored again on a double reverse with Chapman sprinting all the way. Neither team scored in the second period and the scoreboard read 12-0 Henley at the half.

The Jayvees came back in the second half to dominate the play. But the Hornets stubborn defense kept them from scoring in the third quarter.

The final period was a thriller which kept the fans on the edge of their seats until the final whistle. Midway through the last period, the Jayvees drove 50 yards down to the Hornet 10 yard line. Then Smiley Herrera squirted through a hole in the Hornet line and bouncing off three or four Hornets scored standing up. The kick for the extra point was good and this made the score 12-7 with Henley out in front.

With only three minutes left to play, the Jayvees drove from their own 30 to the Henley 10 yard line. Herrera broke loose twice on sparkling runs to lead the KF offense. The Jayvees came down the field going out of bounds several times to keep the clock from running out.

With only two seconds left in the game, the Jayvees tried a

pass which bounced out of the arms of the receiver as he stood on the goal line with a Hornet defender trying to knock the ball away. It was an exciting game all the way with Henley in almost complete charge in the first half and the Jayvees having everything their own way in the second half. The game ended the season for Henley and gave them a season record of six wins, two losses, and two ties. It also brought to a close the career of the following Henley players: Alvin Born, Bob Stevens, Lee Kaylor, Larry Ferguson, Jim Chapman, Warren Sohrakoff, Ron Fleming, Bruce Durrant, Ron Palmer and Charles Hurst.

Dave Moore Favored 12-5 Over Cotero

NEW YORK (UP)—Davey Moore is favored at 12-5 to beat Jose Cotero tonight in their featherweight contenders TV fight at the new Capitol Arena.

This 10-rounder between slambang Moore of Springfield, Ohio, and speedy Cotero of Los Angeles will be televised and broadcast nationally by NBC at 10 p.m. e.s.t.

Each is 24, aggressive and tough. Neither has been stopped. A difference of opinion about their merits is reflected in the rating of the Ring Magazine and the National Boxing Association. The Ring ranks Cotero fifth and Moore sixth. But the NBA tabs Moore number four and Cotero number seven.

Moore is favored because of his four straight victories this year. He won decisions over Gil Cadilli, Buddy McDonald, Isidro Martinez and Victor Quijano.

Meanwhile, in 1957, Cotero won two and lost two. He dropped decisions to Kid Anahuac and Ike Chestnut, but outpointed Larry Bauman and stopped Ricardo Moreno (7).

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Warriors Trip Knicks, 113-101

The Philadelphia Warriors, who are bidding their time until Tom Gola returns from the Army, are nevertheless holding down second place in the Eastern Division of the National Basketball Association.

The Warriors knocked off New York, 113-101, in Thursday night's only scheduled game to give them a 3-2 season's record and a half-game edge over the third-place Knicks. Neil Johnston enjoyed his best night of the season and popped in 34 points for the winners.

Philadelphia took an early 15-6 lead which the Knicks could never overcome. The Warriors led 58-49 at the half and commanded a seven-point margin at the start of the final quarter.

Woody Sauldsberry celebrated his first starting role since coming from the Harlem Globetrotters with an 18-point surge for the Warriors. George Dempsey, who also sparkled on defense, contributed 19 points to the win.
