## Druggist Gets Council Post

DUNSMUIR — George Mannee, Dunsmuir druggist, was appointed to the city council last week to fill the unexpired term of Fred Lloyd, long time councilman and ex-mayor.

Lloyd submitted his resignation and said he is retiring and moving to Sacramento. He had served on the council eight years and was mayor for half of that time.

Harold Beal was appointed as civil defense and disaster director for the city after Mayor J. Morgan Jones said the city could qualify for certain state equipment if its CD program were organized. Lynn Roberts, Siskiyou County CD director, will be asked to appear at the next council meeting and explain the disaster setup.

The council made some headway Wednesday night toward solving its garbage collection problems. Three applicants, Roy Greer, John Smith and John Powers, the present garbage collector, offered to accept either a contract or franchise agreement to collect garbage. The council told the three and any other interested parties to submit written offers at the next meeting. Councilmen seemed to favor a franchise which would completely divorce the city from the garbage business.

At present the city collects the garbage in its own truck. City officials say they have lost about \$5,000 in three years operating the garbage business.
